Why We Believe Genesis 1

- I. Why Christians Should Be Unembarrassed Supernaturalists (A call to believe God's Word over all other claims)
 - God has spoken Scripture is sufficient and truthful in all it affirms.
 - o Genesis 1:1; 2 Timothy 3:16–17
 - Creation reveals the glory of God He spoke, and light burst forth without the sun.
 - o Psalm 19:1; Genesis 1:3
 - Belief in creation is an act of faith
 - o Hebrews 11:3; 2 Corinthians 4:4
- II. What the Text of Genesis Clearly Teaches About the Days of Creation (Four indicators that support a literal 24-hour day)
 - 1. The use of the word "day" (Heb. yom) with an ordinal number
 - o Genesis 1:5 "the first day"
 - o Always used literally in the OT when paired with a number.
 - 2. The waw-consecutive verb forms
 - o Indicates historical narrative (not poetry or allegory).
 - Used 51 times in Genesis 1.
 - 3. The pattern of "evening and morning"
 - Used 37 other times in Scripture—always a normal day.
 - 4. The question of genre: how did God intend for us to read this?
- III. Evaluating Non-Literal Views of Genesis 1 (Common alternative views and their weaknesses)
 - 1. Day-Age View
 - o 2 Peter 3:8 misused; "yom" better rendered differently if meant figuratively.
 - Still conflicts with scientific sequencing of events.
 - 2. Framework Theory
 - o Treats the text as metaphorical or poetic structure.
 - Lacks poetic markers; introduced only ~50 years ago.
 - 3. Theistic Evolution
 - Denies Adam as a historical figure.

- Makes death pre-date sin—contradicts *Romans 5:12*.
- Undermines the authority of Scripture.

IV. What's at Stake in this Debate? (Why this matters for more than just theology of origins)

1. 2,000 years of church testimony

o Honor the wisdom of previous generations (5th Commandment).

2. The clarity and sufficiency of Scripture

- Scripture speaks plainly—not just to scholars.
- o Psalm 119:130 "The unfolding of your words gives light."

3. The integrity of Biblical Christianity and the Gospel

- Adam and Christ are inseparably linked.
- o Romans 5:12, 19; 1 Corinthians 15:22
- o If Adam was not real, Christ's role as the second Adam falls apart.
- o Geerhardus Vos: "If the creation history is an allegory, then the narrative concerning the fall and everything further that follows can also be allegory."

V. Behold the Glory of the Lord Jesus Christ

- He is the Creator (Genesis 1; John 1:1–3), the Redeemer, and the Restorer.
- He wore the thorns of our fallen creation, died, rose, and is making all things new.
- Our hope is not just in a restored Eden, but in a better one secured forever in Him.
 - o Revelation 21:5; Romans 8:19–21
