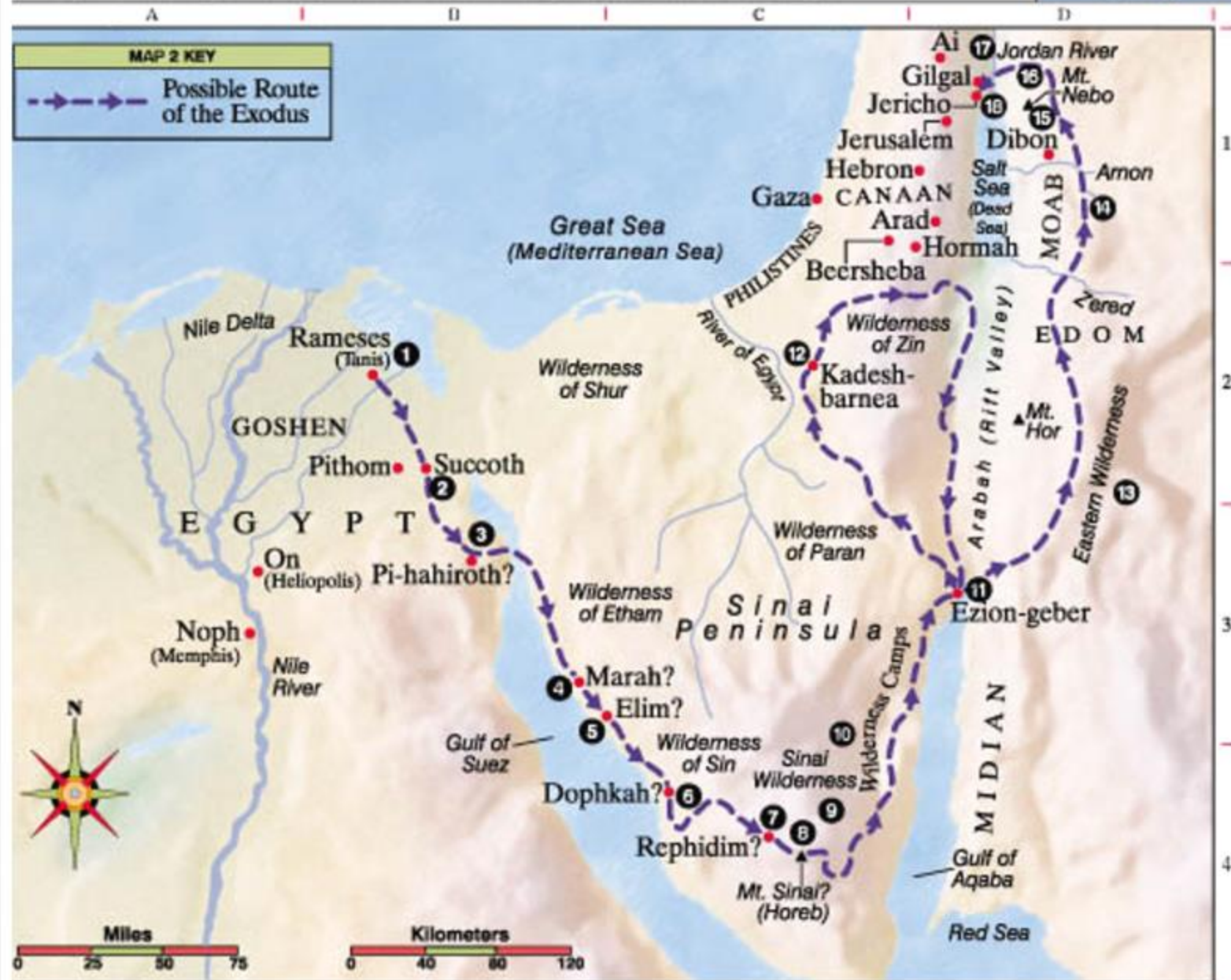
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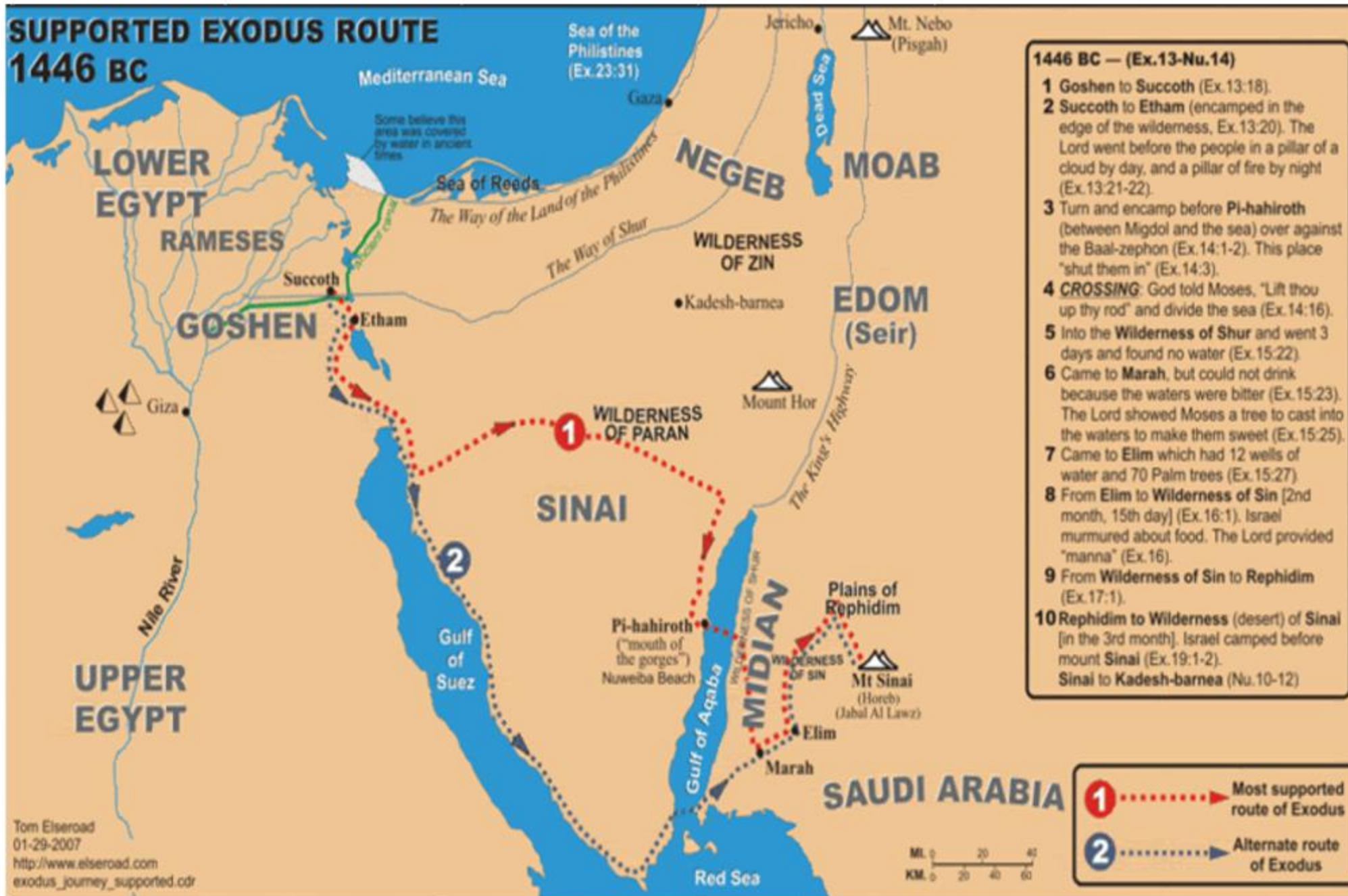


ISRAEL'S EXODUS FROM EGYPT AND ENTRY INTO CANAAN

MAP 2



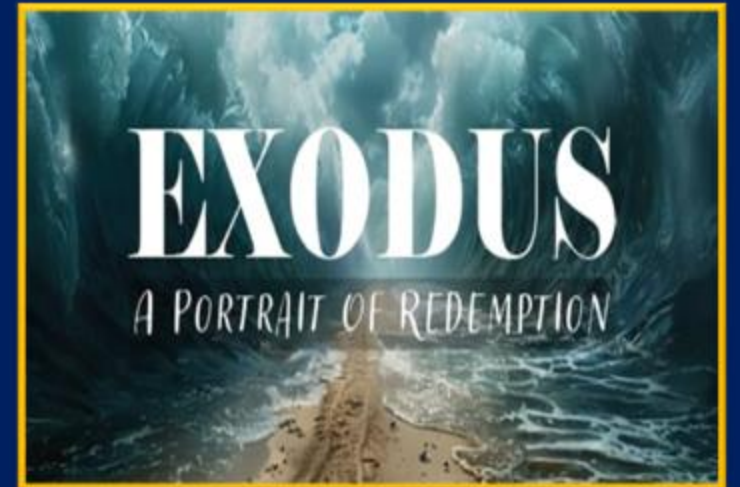
SUPPORTED EXODUS ROUTE 1446 BC

“12:37. Six hundred thousand ... men. This is a round figure; the total number of men aged twenty and older was 603,550 (38:26). Extrapolating from that number, assuming one wife and two children per man, one arrives at an exodus population of roughly two million people. Objections have been commonly raised over the possibility of such an extraordinary population. While enormous energy and scholarly creativity has gone into the development of alternative theories to explain why the population numbers should not be taken at their face value, none has proven definitively convincing.”

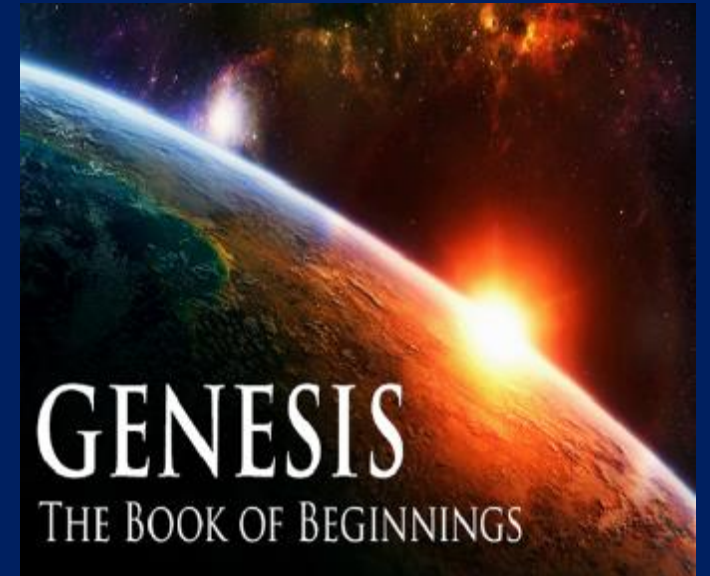

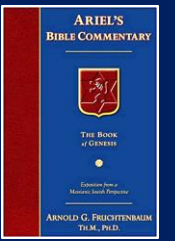

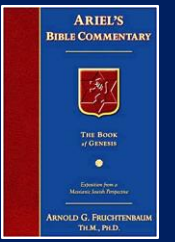


“Therefore, the figure *seventy* includes only Jacob and his immediate descendants: Jacob, twelve sons, fifty-one grandsons, two great grandsons, one daughter, one granddaughter, one unnamed daughter of Leah, and one unnamed granddaughter. If one begins to add the servants and wives plus the women and children absorbed from Shechem (34:29), probably the entire figure would be about three hundred or more. In Acts 7:14, Stephen gave a total figure of seventy-five (75), a figure taken from the *Septuagint* section of Genesis 46:27 and Exodus 1:5, a...

- = 4000 BC for the earth's age

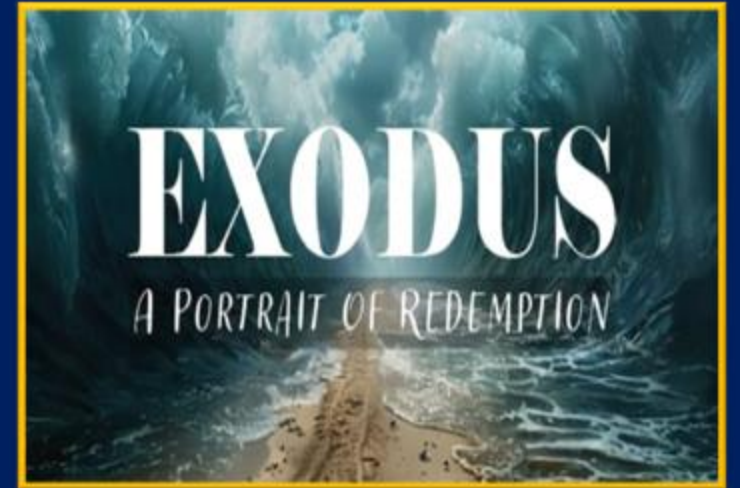




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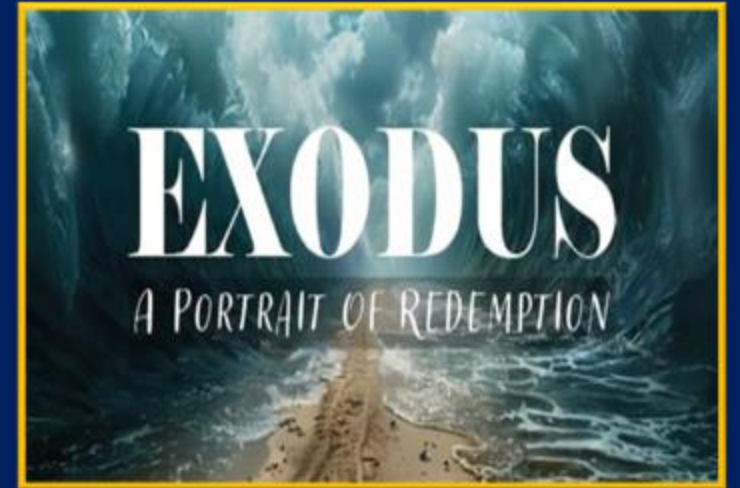

“So Titus retired into the tower of Antonia, and resolved to storm the temple the next day, early in the morning, with his whole army, and to encamp round about the holy house; but, as for that house, God had for certain long ago doomed it to the fire; and now that fatal day was come, according to the revolution of ages; it was the tenth day of the month Lous [Ab], upon which it was formerly burnt by the king of Babylon; although these flames took their rise from the Jews themselves, and were occasioned by them...”
