“Merism. A merism is a form of synecdoche in which the totality or whole is substituted by two contrasting or opposite parts. When the psalmist wrote, ‘You know when I sit and when I rise’ (Ps. 139:2), he was not limiting the Lord’s knowledge to times when he sat down and when he got up. Instead he was saying the Lord knew all his actions.”

“12:29. Those holding to the miraculous intensification of natural events theory of the plagues cannot in any fashion explain the origin of a virus intelligent enough to select only firstborn males. The hand of the Lord is the only satisfactory explanation for this disaster. His promised judgment (4:23) had been rendered.”

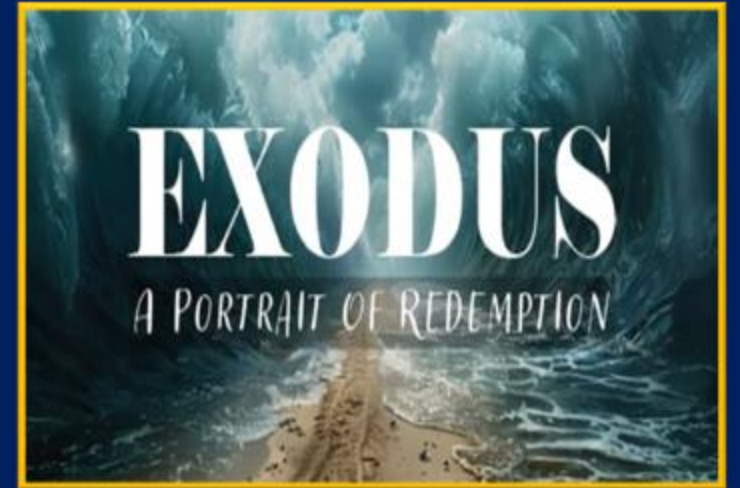
PLAGUES' MIRACULOUS NATURE

- Moses knew about them beforehand (8:10; 9:5, 29)
- Instantaneous appearance and termination
- Description as “signs and wonders” (7:3)
- Intensification
- Timing
- Accomplishment of a moral purpose (11:1)
- Response they invoked from the Egyptian sorcerers (7:22; 8:18-19)
- Last seven plagues did not effect the Jews living in Goshen (9:6)
- Nile into blood affected all rivers, streams, pools, reservoirs, and vessels holding waters

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SUPPORTED EXODUS ROUTE 1446 BC

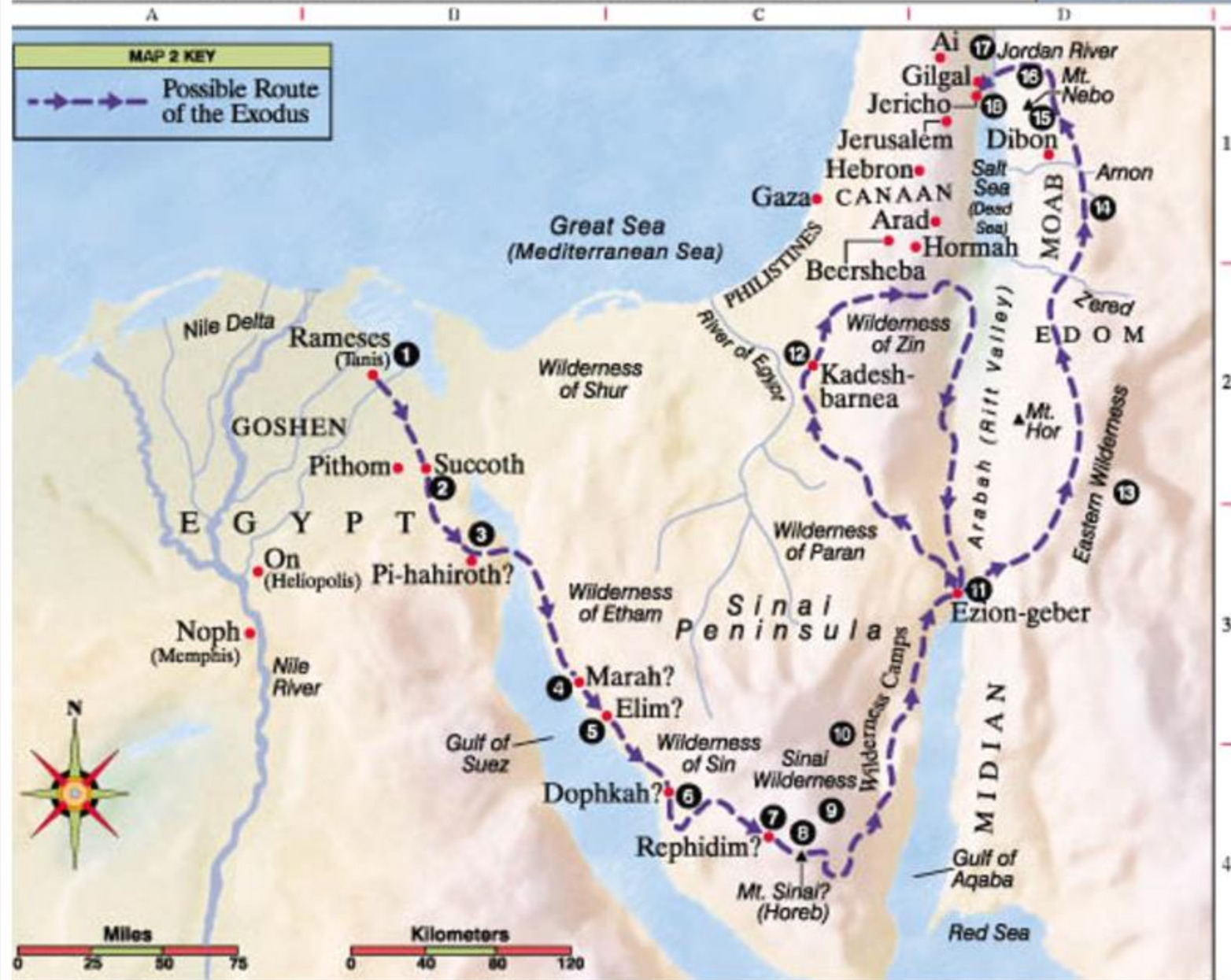


1446 BC — (Ex.13-Nu.14)

- 1 Goshen to Succoth (Ex.13:18).
- 2 Succoth to Etham (encamped in the edge of the wilderness, Ex.13:20). The Lord went before the people in a pillar of a cloud by day, and a pillar of fire by night (Ex.13:21-22).
- 3 Turn and encamp before Pi-hahiroth (between Migdol and the sea) over against the Baal-zephon (Ex.14:1-2). This place "shut them in" (Ex.14:3).
- 4 **CROSSING**: God told Moses, "Lift thou up thy rod" and divide the sea (Ex.14:16).
- 5 Into the Wilderness of Shur and went 3 days and found no water (Ex.15:22).
- 6 Came to Marah, but could not drink because the waters were bitter (Ex.15:23). The Lord showed Moses a tree to cast into the waters to make them sweet (Ex.15:25).
- 7 Came to Elim which had 12 wells of water and 70 Palm trees (Ex.15:27).
- 8 From Elim to Wilderness of Sin [2nd month, 15th day] (Ex.16:1). Israel murmured about food. The Lord provided "manna" (Ex.16).
- 9 From Wilderness of Sin to Rephidim (Ex.17:1).
- 10 Rephidim to Wilderness (desert) of Sinai [in the 3rd month]. Israel camped before mount Sinai (Ex.19:1-2). Sinai to Kadesh-barnea (Nu.10-12).

ISRAEL'S EXODUS FROM EGYPT AND ENTRY INTO CANAAN

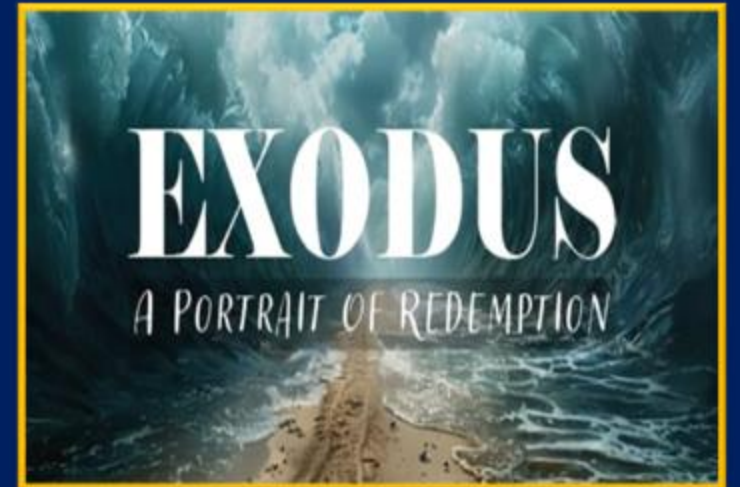

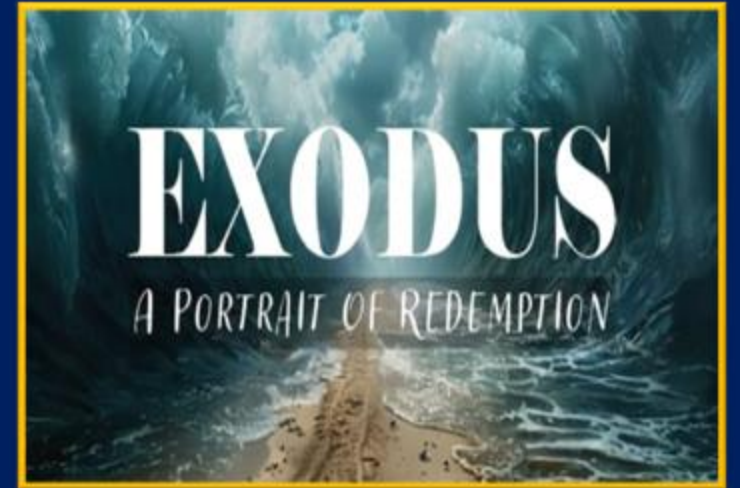

“12:37. Six hundred thousand ... men. This is a round figure; the total number of men aged twenty and older was 603,550 (38:26). Extrapolating from that number, assuming one wife and two children per man, one arrives at an exodus population of roughly two million people. Objections have been commonly raised over the possibility of such an extraordinary population. While enormous energy and scholarly creativity has gone into the development of alternative theories to explain why the population numbers should not be taken at their face value, none has proven definitively convincing.”

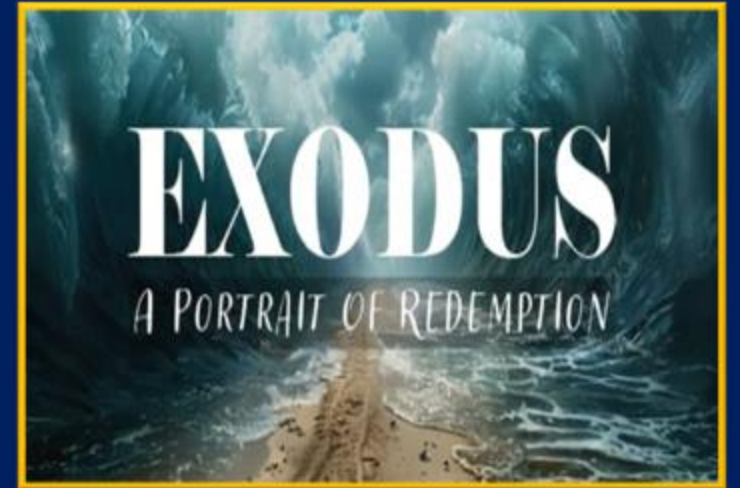

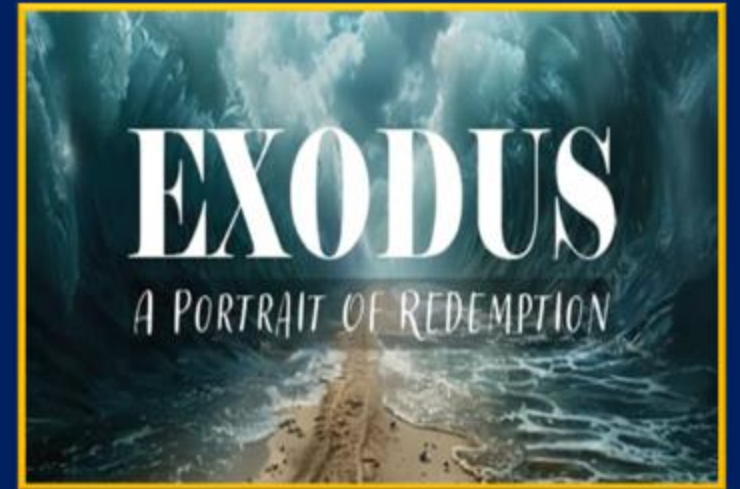

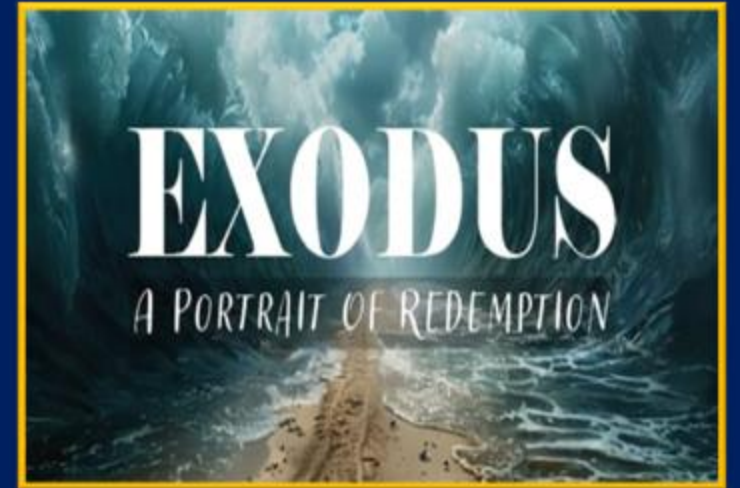




AGE OF THE EARTH?



- 971-931 BC=Solomonic reign
- 966=Solomon rebuilds temple (1 Kgs 6:1b)
- - 480 years for the Exodus' date (1 Kgs 6:1a)
- = 1446 BC for Exodus' date
- - 430 years for Jacob's migration to Egypt (Exod 12:40)
- = 1876 BC for Jacob's migration to Egypt (Gen 46)
- Genealogies of Gen 5; 11
- = 4000 BC for the earth's age

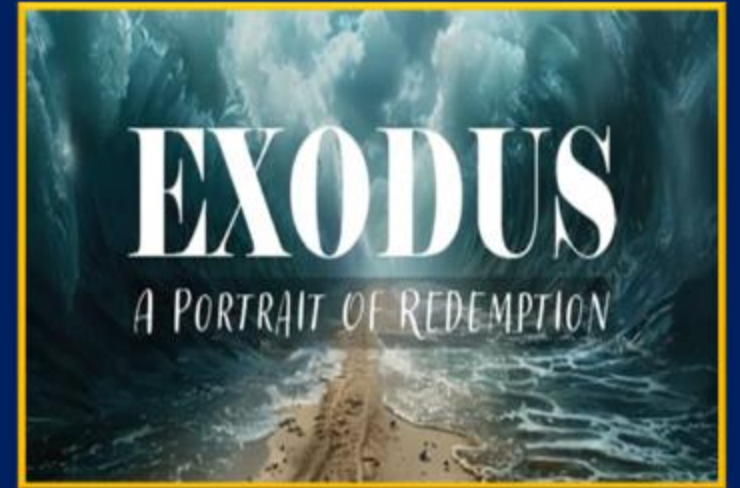




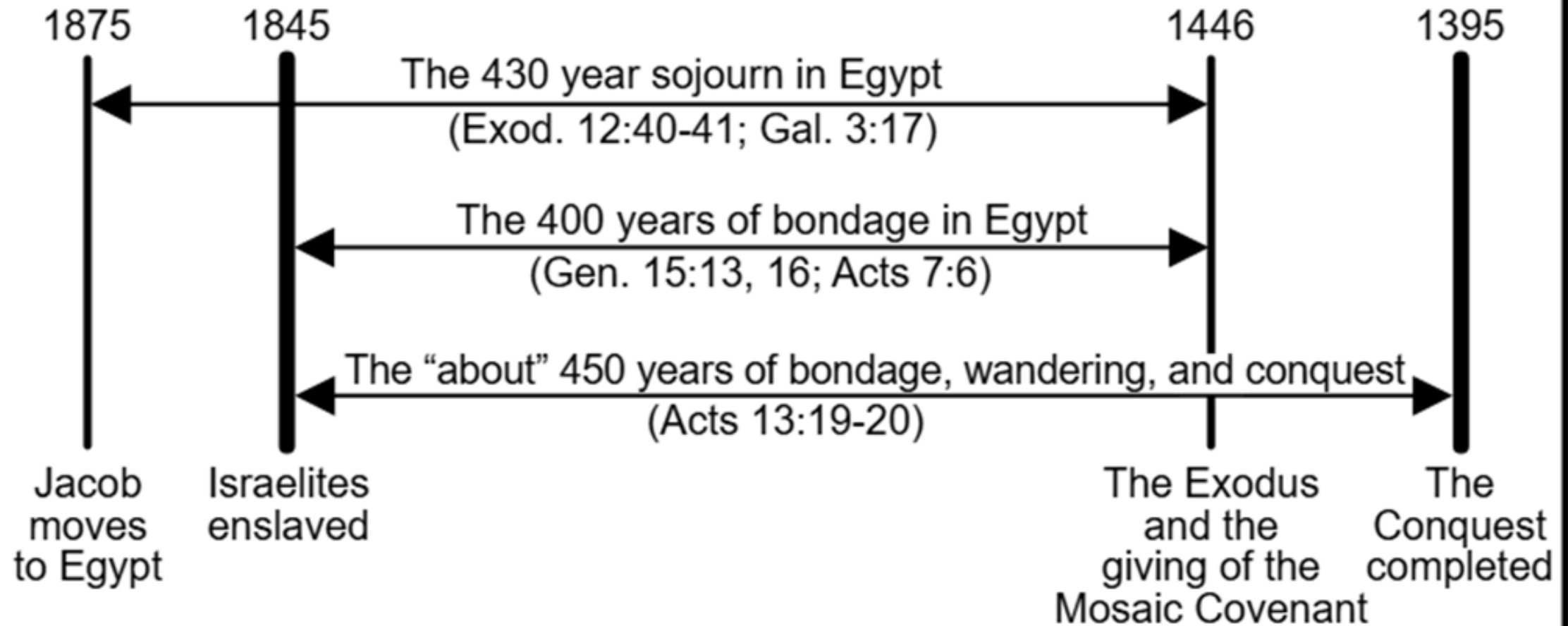
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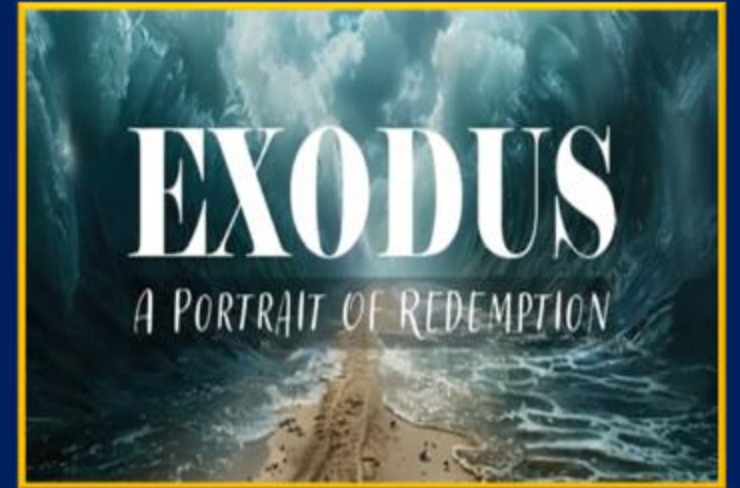
