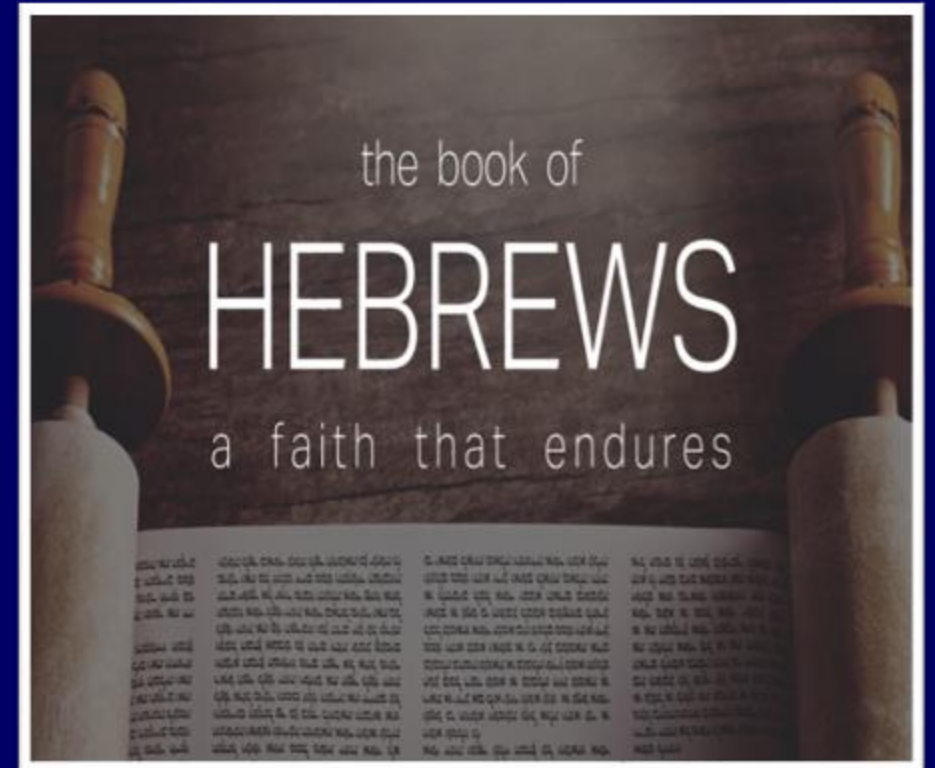
CHRIST IS SUPERIOR TO PREVIOUS REVELATION (1:1-2A)

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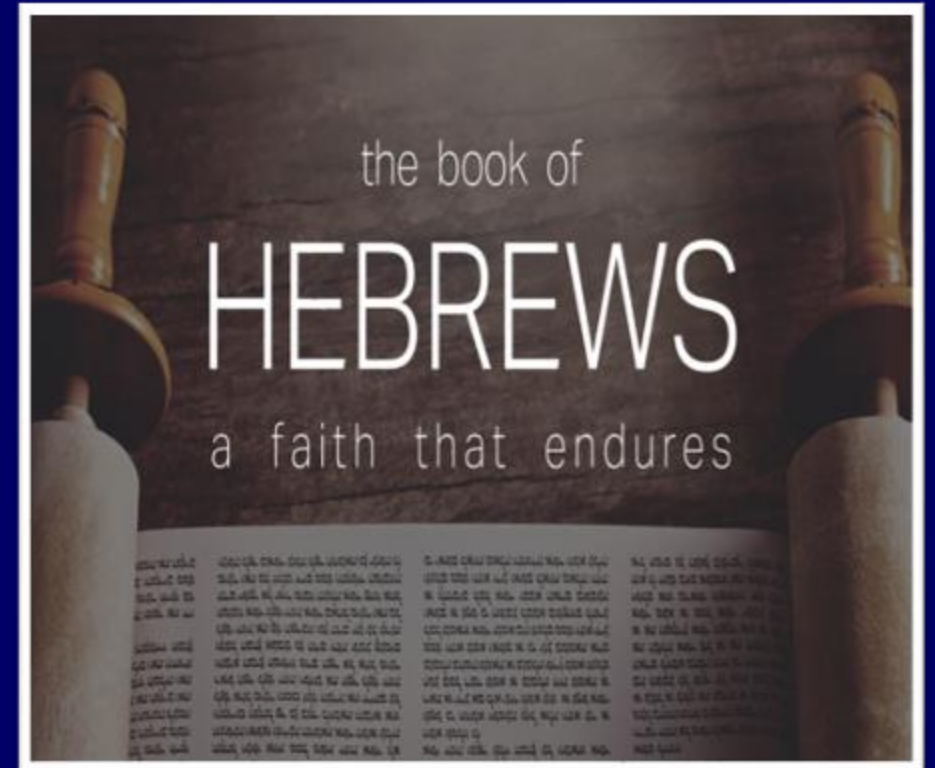


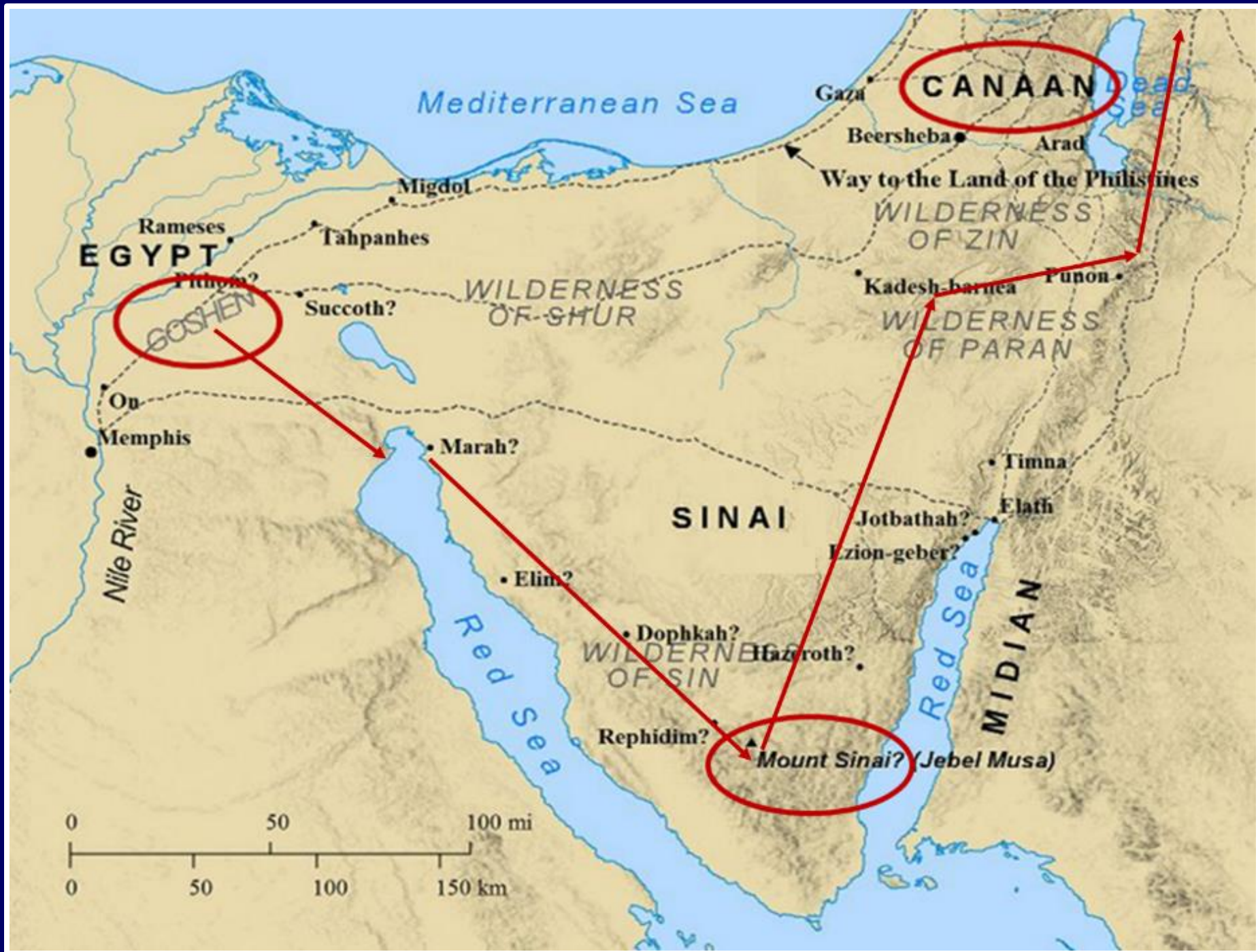
FIVE WARNINGS

2. 3:7–4:13 – Warning against disobedience
3. 5:10–6:20 – Warning against immaturity
4. 10:26-39 – Warning against despising the truth
5. 12:25-29 – Warning against denying the truth

WARNING AGAINST DRIFTING (2:1-4)

- Parenthesis in argument about angels
- From the lesser to the greater (*a fortiori*)

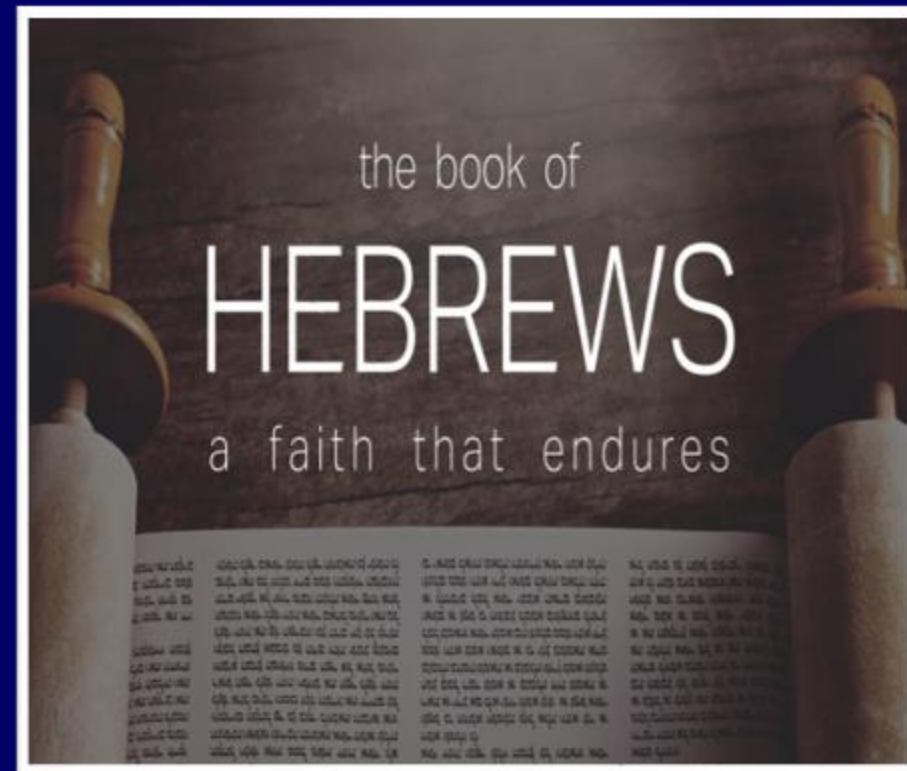
ISRAEL'S JUDGMENTS

“No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten [monogenēs] God who is in the bosom of the Father, He has explained [exēgeomai] *Him*.”





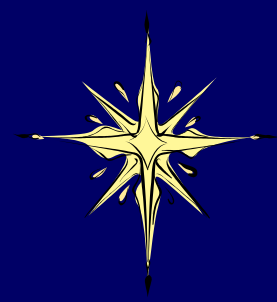

“The act of **kenosis** [**emptying**] as stated in Philippians 2:5-8 may therefore be properly understood to mean that Christ surrendered no attribute of deity, but that He did voluntarily restrict their independent use in keeping with His purpose of living among men and their limitations.”

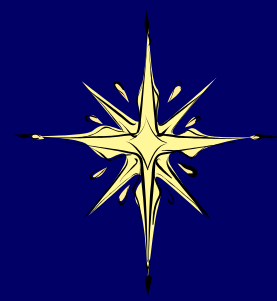

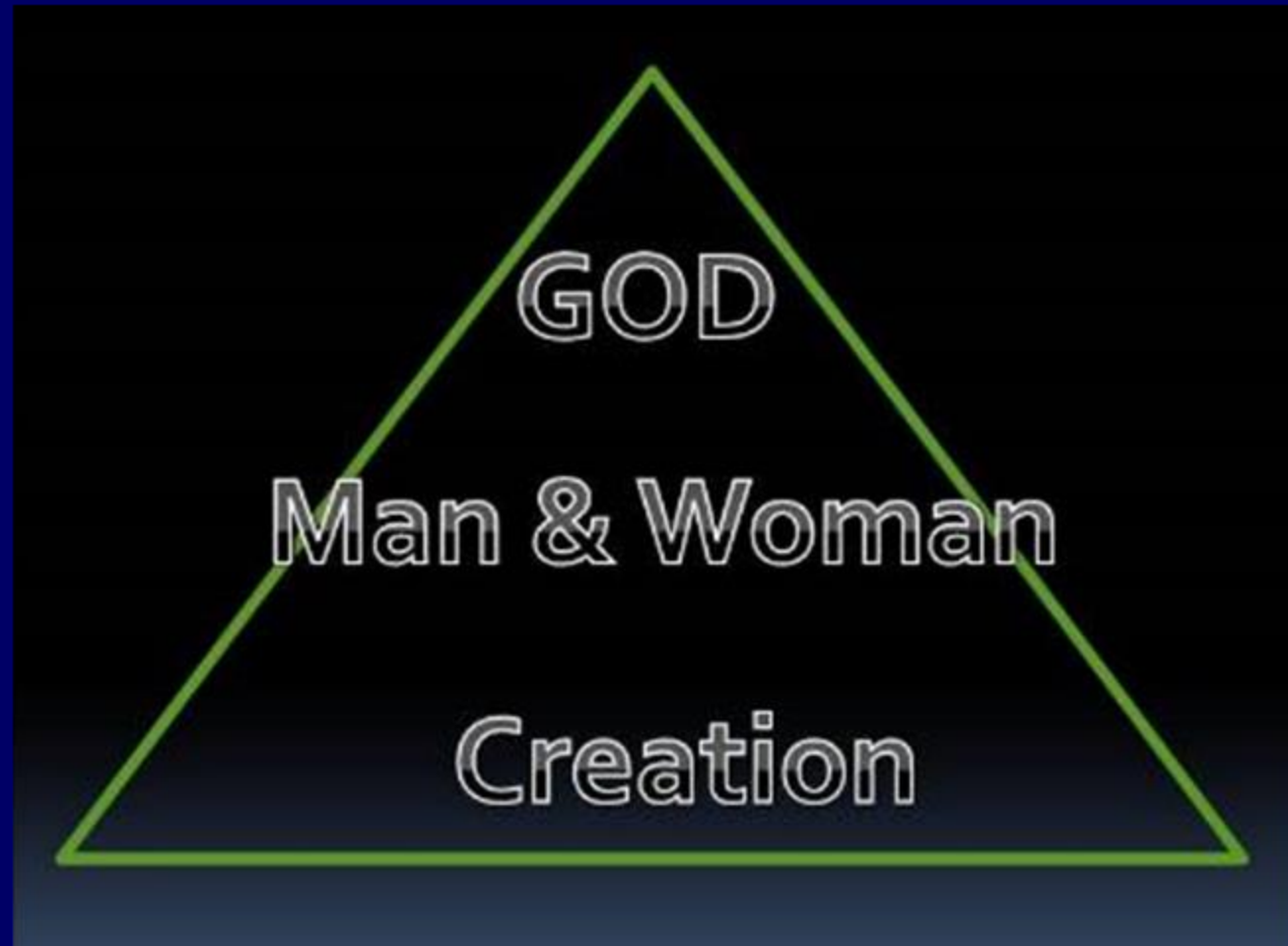
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Genesis 1:26-28

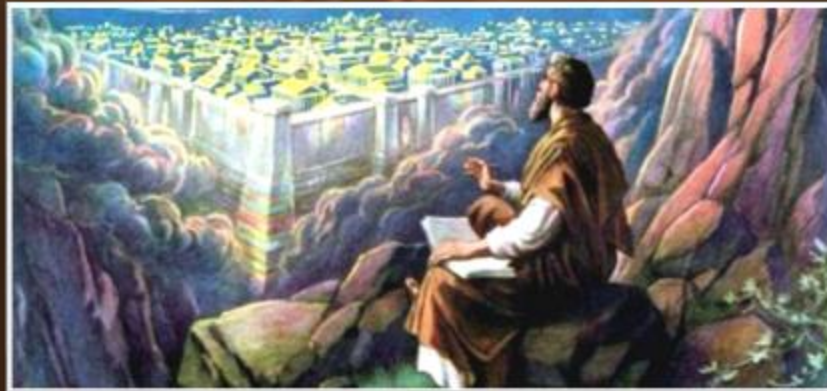

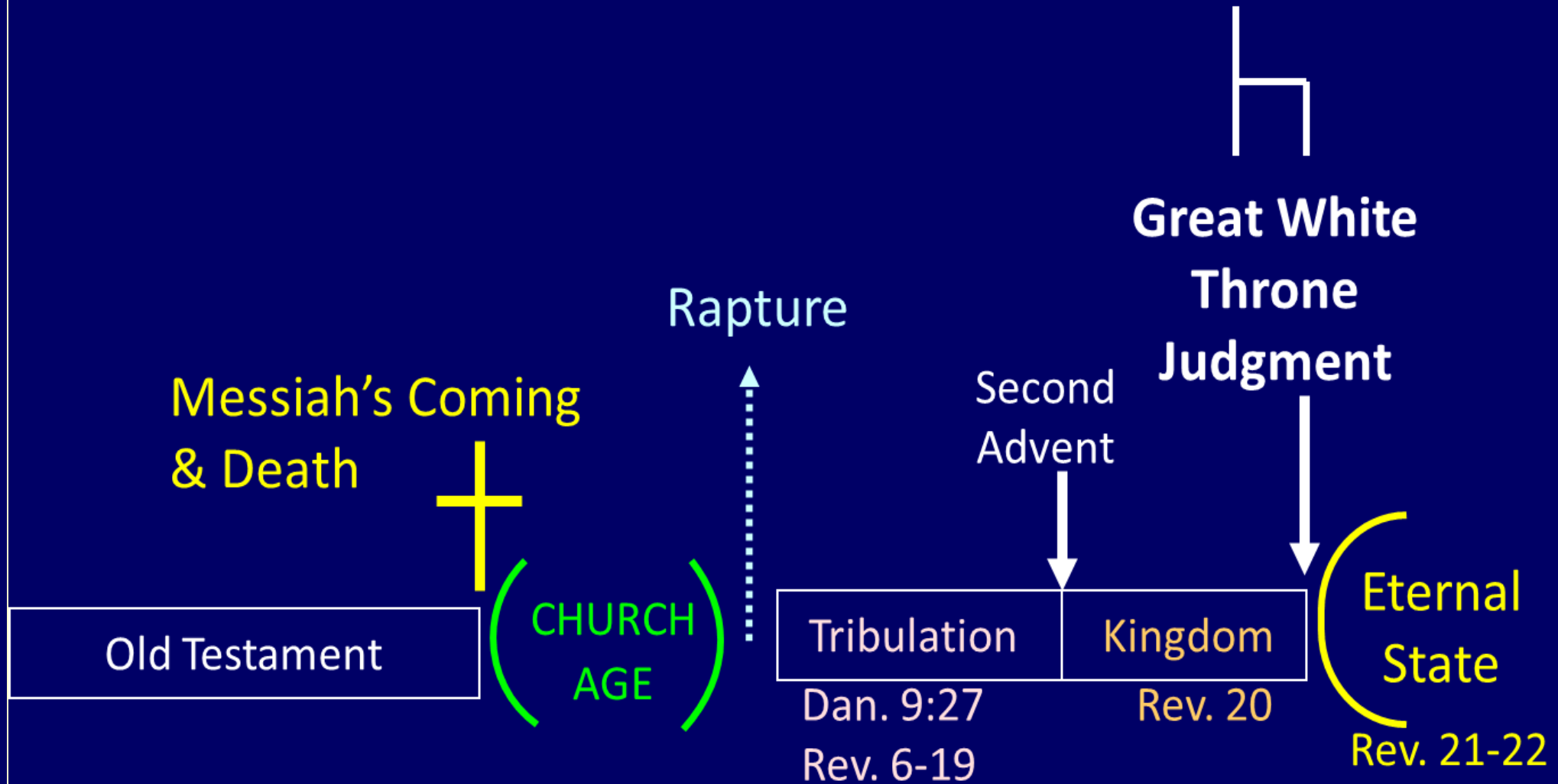

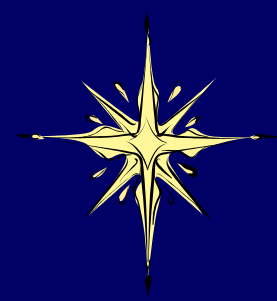


Prophecy Panorama

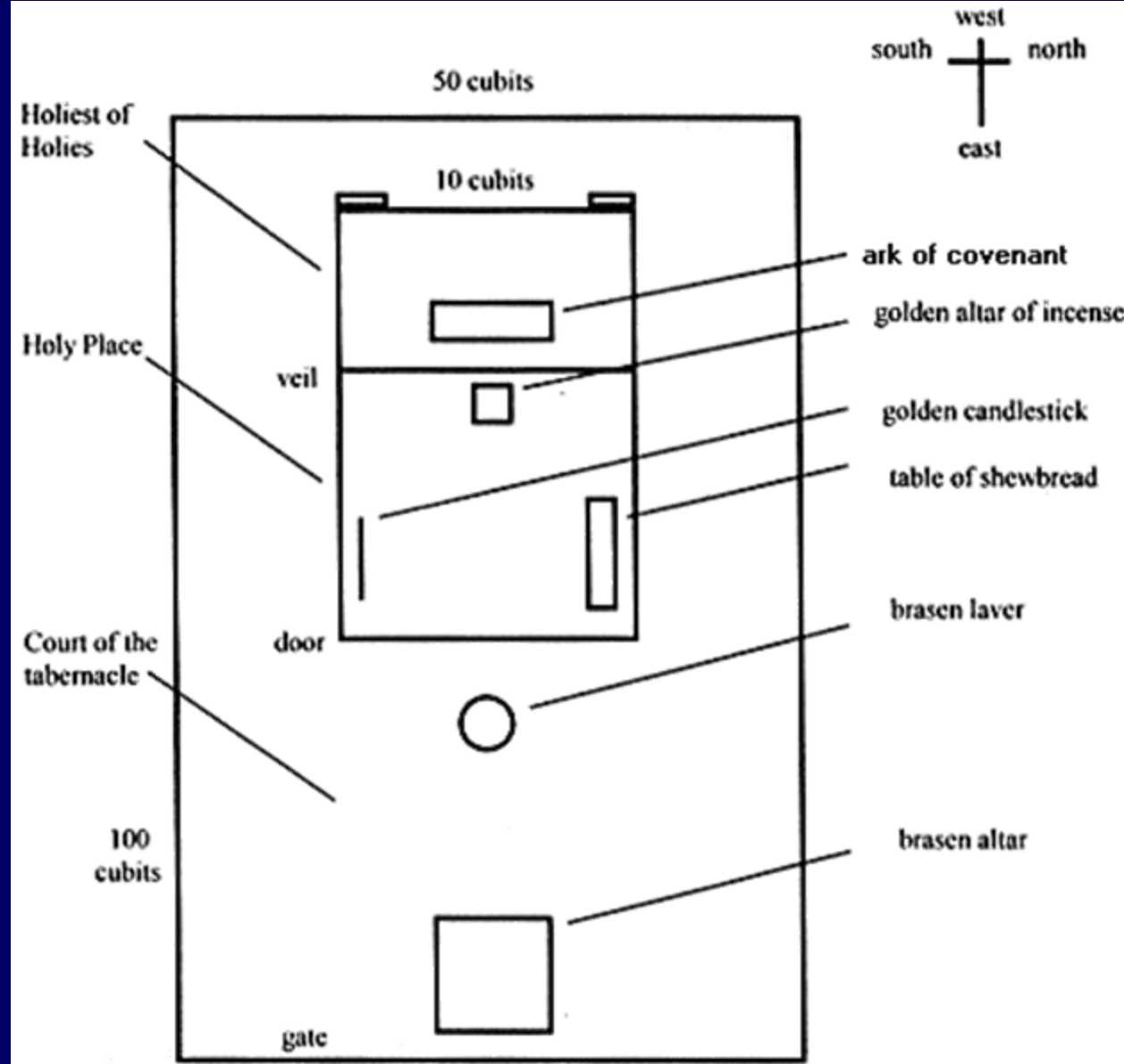

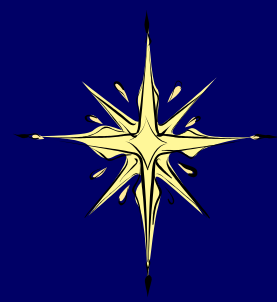
