# Names for God in Genesis

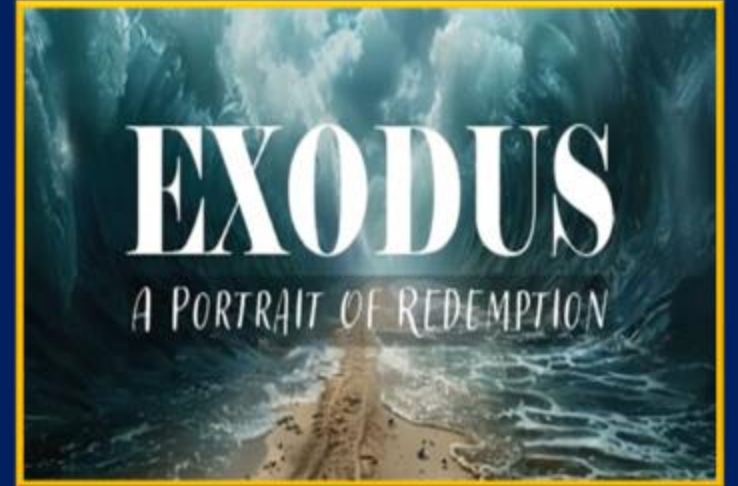


1. Elohim (1:1) – Power
