

# 5-Day Devotional: Pursued by Love

## Day 1: Created with Purpose

Reading: Psalm 139:13-18; Ephesians 2:10

Devotional: Before you took your first breath, God knew you completely. You are not an accident or mistake, but a masterpiece carefully crafted by the Creator of the universe. The lies whisper that you're not enough, that you're unworthy, that nobody loves you. But truth declares something different: you are fearfully and wonderfully made, created with divine intention and eternal purpose.

God doesn't make junk. He designed you uniquely, with specific gifts, talents, and a calling that only you can fulfill. The plans He has for you were established before time began. Today, reject the lies about your worth and embrace this truth: you are God's favorite, chosen and beloved. Your past doesn't define you; God's purpose does.

Reflection: What lies have you believed about yourself? How does knowing God created you with purpose change your perspective?

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## Day 2: The Relentless Pursuit

Reading: Psalm 23; Luke 15:1-7

Devotional: God has been chasing you since the beginning. His goodness and mercy don't just follow you—they pursue you, hunt you down, run after you with relentless love. Even when you hide in shame like Adam and Eve, God comes looking, calling out, "Where are you?" not because He doesn't know, but because He wants relationship with you.

You may have run from God, thinking your sin is too great or your mistakes too many. But God's love is greater than your worst day. He left the ninety-nine to find you. His pursuit isn't about condemnation; it's about restoration. The Creator of everything desires friendship with you specifically.

**Stop running and start receiving. God's not waiting to punish you—He's waiting to embrace you.**

**Reflection: In what areas of your life have you been running from God instead of running to Him?**

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### **Day 3: The Price of Freedom**

**Reading: Romans 5:6-11; 1 Peter 2:24**

**Devotional: You were bought with a price—the precious blood of Jesus Christ. While you were still a sinner, Christ died for you. This wasn't a transaction made after you cleaned yourself up; Jesus paid the ultimate price while you were at your worst. That's the scandal of grace.**

**Every sin, every shame, every mistake was nailed to the cross. Jesus, who never sinned, became sin so you could be made right with God. He didn't just cover your shame like the animal skins in Eden; He erased it completely. The debt is paid in full. The record of charges against you has been canceled.**

**You are not defined by what you've done but by what He did for you. This expensive grace demands a response—not perfection, but devotion. Live for what is right because you've been set free.**

**Reflection: How does understanding the price Jesus paid change how you view your sin and God's forgiveness?**

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### **Day 4: Choosing Life Today**

**Reading: Deuteronomy 30:15-20; Romans 10:9-13**

**Devotional: Today you stand at a crossroads: life or death, blessing or curse, heaven or hell. God places the choice before you with open hands, longing that you would choose life.**

Salvation isn't complicated—it's simply believing in your heart and confessing with your mouth that Jesus is Lord.

This decision isn't just about eternity; it's about today. Choosing Jesus means choosing abundant life now, freedom from the lies that bind you, and hope for your future. It means your children and grandchildren will see what it looks like to serve the Lord wholeheartedly.

Don't wait for a more convenient time. Don't think you need to clean yourself up first. Come as you are. Confess your need, accept His forgiveness, and declare Jesus as Lord of your life. The choice is yours, and today is the day of salvation.

Reflection: **What is holding you back from fully surrendering your life to Jesus? What would choosing life look like for you today?**

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## **Day 5: Living in Resurrection Power**

Reading: **John 14:1-6; Colossians 3:1-4**

Devotional: **Jesus didn't just die—He rose again! Easter celebrates the greatest miracle: death defeated, hell conquered, keys to the grave taken. Because Jesus lives, you can live too. He's preparing a place for you in heaven, and He's coming back for those who are watching and waiting.**

**But resurrection life isn't just about the future; it's about now. You've been made new in Christ. The old is gone; the new has come. This means when you fall, you get back up. When you mess up, you run to the throne of grace. Christians aren't perfect; we're forgiven and being transformed.**

**Live boldly in this resurrection power. Don't let past failures keep you from your future purpose. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life—follow Him wholeheartedly. Let your life be marked by gratitude for what He's done and anticipation for what He's preparing.**

Reflection: **How can you live today in the power of Christ's resurrection? What needs to change in your life to reflect that you belong to Him?**
