Every generation assumes they know what will bring them the good life. The Bible is a chronicle of people seeking fulfillment and love in 'all the wrong places.' These ancient stories are shockingly relevant for even a technologically advanced culture like our own. The book of Jeremiah provides one of these stories.

As a teenager God called Jeremiah to be his voice to the nations. He is called the 'weeping prophet' because of the depressing spiritual condition of his people. His warnings of impending disaster fall on deaf ears. Jeremiah says "They have lied about the Lord; they said, "He will do nothing! No harm will come to us, we will never see sword or famine. The prophets are but wind, and the word is not in them; so let what they say be done to them." (5:12-13) The people have forgotten the God who delivered their ancestors from slavery and gave them a new homeland.

The people now make idols of wood and stone to honor the gods Baal (or Molech) and Astarte, the Queen of Heaven. Archeologists say these horrendous practices included mandatory temple prostitution for women and young men and the sacrifice of infants by fire to insure plentiful rains and a bountiful harvest. Jeremiah weeps the words of God, "And they have built the high places of Topheth, which is in the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, to burn their sons and their daughters in the fire, which I did not command, nor did it come into my mind.
