Sermon "Abiding in Christ's Love" John 15:9-17

The Third Article

Sharing words of faith confessed around the world, we speak together the words of the Apostles' Creed regarding the Third Person of the Holy Trinity and then express our confession of its meaning in the Small Catechism words of Martin Luther.

On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.
