

- **Ephesians 6:11-13, 17 TPT** ... 11 Put on God’s complete set of armor provided for us, so that you will be protected as you fight against the evil strategies of the accuser! 12 Your hand-to-hand combat is not with human beings, but with the highest principalities and authorities operating in rebellion under the heavenly realms ... For they are a powerful class of demon-gods and evil spirits that hold this dark world in bondage. 13 Because of this, you must wear all the armor that God provides so you’re protected as you confront the slanderer, for you are destined for all things and will rise victorious.

### Where Was My Protection?

**Biblical Perception** is the ability to see beneath the outward form to the underlying, often hidden reality.

**Human Perception** is the quality, state, or capability, of being affected by something external; sensation; sensibility (a person's delicate sensitivity that makes them readily offended or shocked)

**Biblical Perspective** is viewing the world and human life based on the divine inspiration and authority of scripture.

**Human Perspective** considers human factors and the human experience formulating ideas, problem solving and decisions.

### BETRAYED BY GOD

- **John 16:33 AMP** ... I have told you these things, so that in Me you may have [perfect] peace. In the world you have tribulation and distress and suffering, but be courageous [be confident, be undaunted, be filled with joy]; I have overcome the world.” [My conquest is accomplished, My victory abiding.]
- **Ephesians 1:13 AMP** - In Him, you also, when you heard the word of truth, the good news of your salvation, and [as a result] believed in Him, were stamped with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit [the One promised by Christ] as owned and protected [by God].
