

Who am I "All In" for?

- **John 1:10-12; 14** ... He came into the very world he created, but the world didn't recognize him. He came to his own people, and even they rejected him. But to all who believed him and accepted him, he gave the right to become Children of God. Move to verse 14: So the Word became human and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.

 **Point 1: Jesus was HUMAN and DIVINE at the same time.**

- **Matthew 2:1** ... Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, He was **BORN**
- **Luke 4:2** ... Being forty days **TEMPTED** of the devil. And in those days he did eat nothing: and when they were ended, he afterward **HUNGRED**.
- **Mark 4:38** ... But He was in the **STORM**, asleep on a pillow. And they awoke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing?"
- **John 11:35** ... Jesus **WEPT**.
- **Luke 22:42** ... saying, "Father, if it is Your will, take this cup of **SUFFERING** away from Me; nevertheless not My will,
- **John 19:28** ... After this, Jesus, knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, said, "I **THIRST!**"

Notes:

 **Point 2: Recognize He IS the Messiah**


- **John 1:14** ... And we have seen his glory, the glory of the Father's one and only Son.
- **Luke 3:15** ... Everyone was expecting the Messiah to come soon, and they were eager...
- **Matthew 8:27** ... The disciples were amazed. 'Who is this man?' They asked. 'Even the winds and waves obey Him.'
- **Matthew 16:13** ... He asked His disciples, 'Who do people say that the Son of Man is?' 'Well', they replied, 'some say John the Baptist, some say Elijah, and others say Jeremiah or one of the other prophets'
- **Mark 3:11** ... And whenever those possessed by evil spirits caught sight of him, the spirits would throw them to the ground in front of him shrieking, 'You are the Son of God'.

Notes:

 **Point 3: Don't Doubt what you FEEL and what you SEE.**

- **Luke 24:19** ... The things that happened to Jesus, the man from Nazareth,' they said. 'He was a prophet who did powerful miracles, and he was a mighty teacher in the eyes of God and all the people. But our leading priests and other religious leaders handed him over to be condemned to death, and they crucified Him. We had hoped He was the Messiah....'
- **Luke 24:25-26** ... Then Jesus said to them, 'You foolish people! You find it so hard to believe all that the prophets wrote in the Scriptures. Wasn't it clearly predicted that the Messiah would have to suffer all these things before entering his glory?'
- **Luke 24:32** ... Didn't our hearts burn within us as he talked with us on the road and explained the Scriptures to us
- **Luke 24:36** ... says that "Jesus himself was suddenly standing there among them" Verse 37 "But the whole group was startled and frightened, thinking they were seeing a ghost! 'Why are you frightened?' He asked. "Why are your hears filled with doubt? Look at my hands. Look at my feet. You can see that it's really me. Touch me and make sure that I am not a ghost..."

Notes:

 **Point 4: He Shows us "WOUNDS" even today.**

- **Luke 1:1-2 & 4** "Many people have set out to write accounts about the events that have been fulfilled among us. They used the eyewitness reports circulating among us from the early disciples. So you can be certain of the truth of everything you were taught.
- **Luke 14:34-35** ... Salt is good for seasoning. But if it loses its flavor, how do you make it salty again? Flavorless salt is good neither for the soul nor for the manure pile. It is thrown away.
