REPENTANCE ISN'T.../ REPENTANCE IS...

Church Family, I was sent this by a member: I love it and wanted to share it with you. Please take time to read it.

Repentance isn't groveling for forgiveness you already have—it's changing your mind to align with how God sees you and your situation.

Your new nature doesn't repent from sin; it repents toward God. You're not constantly apologizing for who you are or begging for acceptance you already possess. You're adjusting your perspective to match His truth about who you've always been in Christ.

True repentance is about upgrading your mindset, not downgrading your identity.

Here's the New Creation approach to repentance:

- You repent from wrong thinking, not from your identity

- You align your mind with God's perspective, not grovel for His acceptance

- You change your viewpoint, not your standing with Him

- You adjust your lens to see what He sees, not apologize for existing
- You turn toward His truth about you, not away from who you are

A mindset can only be replaced with another mindset. When you realize you've been thinking wrong about yourself, God, or your situation, you don't need to punish yourself. You need to reframe your perspective to match His upstairs view.

The old covenant said "repent and then God will forgive." The new covenant says "because God has forgiven, now you can repent" without fear or condemnation.

Your repentance flows from security, not insecurity. From love, not fear. From identity confidence, not identity crisis. You're safe to acknowledge wrong thinking because your standing with God isn't based on perfect thinking.

When you mess up, the question isn't "How do I get back in God's good graces?" The question is "How does God want to reframe my thinking about this situation?"

Kingdom routine: When guilt or condemnation tries to accompany repentance, reset to rest in your forgiven identity. God isn't waiting for you to grovel—He's waiting to

show you His perspective on what happened.

God loves you and so do I!



Vision:

We are disrupting the cycle of darkness and despair for all who are behind bars and beyond. It's the power of the Gospel that produces change, brings redemption, and allows everyone to find their purpose in Christ. Statement of Faith:

- We believe that "all Scripture is given by inspiration of God," by which we understand that the whole Bible is inspired in that holy men of God were "moved by the Holy Spirit" to write the very words of God. We believe that this divine inspiration extends equally to all parts of the writings as they appeared in the original manuscripts.
- We believe that the Godhead eternally exists in three Persons The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit and that these three are one God; co-equal and co-existent.
- We believe that the eternal Son of God came into this world that He might manifest God to men, fulfill prophecy, and become the Redeemer of a lost world. He was born of a virgin, conceived by the Holy Spirit, received a human body and a sinless human nature

- We believe that the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the blessed Trinity, though omnipresent from all eternity, indwells every believer since the day of Pentecost, and by His baptism unites all of Christ's own into one body. He is the source of all power and all acceptable worship and service.

We believe that God has ordained that through the local church the Gospel of Jesus Christ is to be spread and that it is the duty of everyone who is born again, to seek out a local fellowship for the furtherance of the Gospel and his own edification. We believe in the literal resurrection of the body, the everlasting blessedness of the saved and the everlasting punishment of the lost. We believe that the supreme mission of God's people in this age is to preach the Gospel to every creature, and we believe in the second coming of Christ
