I Was a Christian Missionary to the Peoples Republic of China by David Douglas

If you're applying for a visa to the Peoples Republic of China, don't put that as your reason for going; it'll end up in the trash. Fortunately, I didn't have to give a reason. I was invited to go to China by Tianjin University, a government institution, to teach English. The University knew I was a Christian. I provided my credentials: a bachelor's degree in English from Whitman College and a master's degree in education from Golden Gate Baptist Seminary.

I arrived at Beijing Airport in August of 2001. I was met by a car with driver and one of the university's professors. During the two-hour drive to Tianjin, the professor asked if I was a "spiritual person." I said yes, I was. He told me that although I could explain religious references in books the students might read, I was not allowed to teach religion. After I moved into my oncampus apartment, the head of the university's Communist Party came to welcome me, and gave me the same warning. It was repeated in the contract I signed.

I found one venue where I could share my faith. The University hosted an "English Night" every Saturday outside the student activities building. People came from all over Tianjin to practice their English. I went every opportunity I had and was often the only foreigner there. I learned to stand with my back against the building, or I was quickly surrounded. Almost every time I went, someone would ask questions about religion. I always began by saying I believed in God and had a personal relationship with Him. Apparently, no one ever complained to the authorities about that.

One evening, two young women came to my apartment, to ask a question about one of their Chinese classes. The question was so trivial I wondered why they bothered, but I did my best to give them an answer. Then one whispered, "Is your apartment bugged?" I wondered that myself when I first moved in. "No, I don't think so," I told them.

"We understand that when a person has problems, they can pray to God for help. Is that true?" one of the girls asked. "Yes, it is." I gave them my personal testimony, how I came to believe in God and accept Jesus as my personal savior. I didn't press them to make a decision at that time, because I felt they needed more background about Christianity.

When the girls left, I immediately emailed a friend in Phoenix and asked if she could find a

DVD of the *Jesus* film. She did and mailed it to me. I got a phone call one day saying I had a package at the FedEx office. I had to go there to pick it up.

I arrived at the office and learned I would have to open the box in front of an officer of the Communist Party; she would inspect the contents. In addition to the DVD, my friend included many religious tracts. The officer glanced at the tracts and put them back in the box. She took the DVD, went into a back room, and was gone almost half an hour. I knew she was watching the movie. "She's not going to let me keep it" kept going through my mind. When she came back, she dropped the DVD in the box and handed it to me. "You may go." I think God was there.

I showed the Jesus movie to the two girls, and they did become Christians, as did the mother of one of the girls. I left the DVD in China when I returned to the U.S.

Two other students, who came to the United States to get masters degrees, also accepted Jesus as Savior, thanks to Southern Baptists. One became a Christian through Baptist Campus Ministries, the other through a Southern Baptist church in California that a Chinese-American Christian took her to when the church was studying *Experiencing God*.

The Chinese constitution includes a statement, "There is no God." Yet one can find Him even there. Our God has no boundaries.

It's a Miracle! God Heals This Pastor as He Preaches on Healing

This story of **Duane Miller's** healing is, well, almost too miraculous to believe. Incredibly, though, it was caught on an audio recording.

As Pastor Matt Fry of C3 Church in North Carolina explains in the following video, Miller was a pastor in Texas who got sick with something like the flu. This particular flu was so severe that it attacked Miller's vocal cords and left him without much of a voice. Miller was so desperate to recover his voice, he consulted over 200 doctors, including 63 specialists. All to no avail.

A year after losing his voice, Miller had to step down from his position at his church and went through great difficulty as he tried to find a different job he could do without the use of his voice. Miller and his family eventually ended up as members of a large church in Houston.

One Sunday, a **Bible study teacher** wasn't able to teach due to sickness, and knowing Miller's background, the church asked him to teach the class. Miller was hesitant at first, but eventually agreed and was outfitted with a special microphone that would be able to pick up whatever sound he was able to produce.

It just so happened that the lesson queued up for that week was on **Psalm 103**—which speaks of the fact that God heals our sin, but doesn't always heal our physical bodies.

At about [4:30] in the following video, you'll hear the voice Miller had grown accustomed to speaking with for three painful years—strained and barely audible. Yet as he is speaking of the Lord's goodness and explaining that God still performs miracles in our day and age, something incredible happens. All of a sudden his voice loosens and he is able to speak clearly.

Miller's shock is audible and so is the crowd's. You can hear nervous laughter in the audience as the room starts to realize what is happening before their very eyes. Miller resumes talking—hesitantly at first. "I don't understand this right now...I'm a bit overwhelmed at the moment...I'm not quite sure what to say or do." More gasps and curious laughter from the crowd. "Sounds funny to say: I'm at a loss for words!"

As he realizes what is happening, though, Miller breaks out with a "**Thank you Lord**." You can hear him choke up (with emotion this time) as he does the only thing he can think to do: Read the Scripture with his newly recovered voice.

Honestly, you have to hear it for yourself to grasp the full significance. It's nothing short of hearing God perform a miracle in real time.
















A SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP

Have you ever noticed how in the Scriptures men are always going up into the mountains to commune with the Lord?

Yet in the Scriptures we hardly ever hear of women going to the mountains. But we know why — right?

Because the women were too busy keeping life going; they couldn't abandon babies, meals, homes, fires, gardens, and a thousand responsibilities to make the climb into the mountains!

I was talking to a friend the other day, saying that as modern woman I feel like I'm never "free" enough from my responsibilities, never in a quiet enough space I want with God.

Her response floored me, "That is why God comes to women. Men have to climb the mountain to meet God, but God comes to women wherever they are."

I have been pondering on her words for weeks and have searched my Scriptures to see that what she said is true. God does indeed come to women where they are, when they are doing their ordinary, everyday work.

He meets them at the wells where they draw water for their families, in their homes, in their kitchens, in their gardens.

He comes to them as they sit beside sickbeds, as they give birth, care for the elderly, and perform necessary mourning and burial rites.

In these seemingly mundane and ordinary tasks, these women of the Scriptures found themselves face to face with divinity.

So if — like me — you ever start to be moan the fact that you don't have as much time to spend in the mountains with God as you would like. Remember, God comes to women. He knows where we are and the burdens we carry. He sees us, and if we open our eyes and our hearts, we will see Him, even in the most ordinary places and in the most ordinary things.

He lives. And he's using a time such as this to speak to women around the world.
