

Sky Harbor's field was built by Scenic Airways Inc. in 1928-29 and purchased by Acme when the builders left town following the depression. East and west about 5,000 feet were available and north-south a short half mile was usable by dodging the two farms shown in the far left and right center. The hangar was 100 by 100 ft., made of steel and brick with a concrete floor and the tower was two and a half stories tall, containing two small rooms. The concrete taxi and warm up pad extended to the airline terminal which housed the office, radio room, and the weather bureau. The property was purchased by the City of Phoenix in 1935. Know Doubt weekly devotional - Christmas Memories

Christmas Day 2025 is now history, but you might still be visiting or celebrating into the New Year. What are some of your fondest memories of this recent Christmas? Was it a memorable gift, a dinner, a party, or a family gathering? Were there some things you would rather forget? A speeding ticket, an argument, the turkey getting burned, a gift sweater several sizes too big, or working a shift as a first responder?

Perhaps some of your memories fit in with Americans who responded to a survey of what they planned to do this Christmas.¹ Not surprisingly, more than 97% of those who identified themselves as Christian planned to celebrate Christmas. Even 3 out of every 4 people who said they were not affiliated with any religion, or were of a non-Christian religion, also intended to observe Christmas Day; although no mention was made of how they would celebrate.

Half of all Americans were planning to attend church during the Christmas season, including 21% of those who were religiously unaffiliated. A majority of the unaffiliated were willing to go to a church service if someone they knew invited them.

Among Christians (churched and unchurched) as well as those of non-Christian religions, 53% said they could retell parts of the biblical story of the birth of Jesus, but few (22%) felt they could describe it accurately.

What is the attraction of the unchurched and non-Christian to the Christmas season? Perhaps it is a time to remember “peace on earth and goodwill toward men” (Luke 2:14). All of us are aware of wars and violence, not just in foreign lands, but in our own families and local communities. We all want some kind of peace, whether we define it merely as the absence of hostility, or as an inner calm.

Peace and goodwill certainly abound at Christmas. Cheerful greetings are expressed, even to strangers. Gifts are given and received. Friends or family gather for special meals. Houses and churches are brightly decorated. Worship services feature lovely carols extolling peace and joy.

Imbedded in Christmas is a truth not often mentioned: the “why” of God’s plan (John 3:16). Christmas rightly celebrates the birth, but many churches barely mention the requirements for salvation: Jesus suffered and died for our sins (1 Peter 2:24); and our

confession of Him as Lord and Savior (Romans 10:9-10). The birth narrative is lovely but not challenging, the death of Jesus is uncomfortable but believable; however, the idea of repentance arouses self-denial. Yet Christmas takes us to Easter; and without Easter, Christmas would have little importance.

What Christmas 2025 memories do you have? How many people did you greet with

“Merry Christmas” and how many acts of goodwill did you do joyfully? Were you invited, or did you invite someone, to a Christmas service? Did you hear, or tell someone, the whole biblical story of the birth? To the peace and goodwill of Christmas, did you include the “why”?

It is said that memories last a lifetime. My hope is your Christmas memories will, especially those where you helped someone understand the “why” of Jesus’ birth.

The Wisdom message

I had been studying the subject of wisdom in the Bible for several years for my own personal curiosity and had gained a lot spiritually from the exercise. But I struggled with why I was excited about those study times, while others didn't seem all that interested. I even asked a national speaker at a conference I was attending IF anyone nationally was focusing on the subject of wisdom. He looked at me oddly and just said, "No."

In my discouragement, God had me look at the passages in the Bible about wise men. I came across Matt. 23:34, which says, "Therefore, I am sending you prophets and wise men and writers..." I had stumbled on a neglected list of spiritual gifts promised to us from Jesus. Included in this list is wise men. Jesus wants His Church to be full of wise men and women. That was the moment I committed to never being discouraged about my personal call to be wise, and the moment I asked God to help me become a wise man.

Often, I hear God asking me, "What do you really want?" And I respond that I want to be a godly man, of faith and wisdom. Because Jesus wants us all to be wise.

He promises in James 1:5 that if we lack wisdom, we need only to ask for it.
