Discovering Strength in Times of Trouble: Finding Hope in Psalm 73:24-26 Often Marines during arduous training exercises will answer the question, "How are you doing?" with a sarcastic response, "Great! Every day is an adventure, and every meal is a feast."

The adventure part is probably true, but I would hardly call Meals ready to Eat (MRE's) sumptuous fare.

Some people cope with hard times with stoicism mixed with a little sarcasm; but most of us find that turning to God's word is our best way of finding encouragement and hope.

These verses from Psalm 73, offers a comforting message by reminding us of the strength that can be found in God's unwavering presence.

Psalm 73:23-26

23 **"Yet I am always with you;**

you hold me by my right hand.

24 You guide me with your counsel,

and afterward you will take me into glory.

25 Whom have I in heaven but you?

And earth has nothing I desire besides you."

When we seek the Lord's presence, we are assured that he is with us and that he will guide us. Our thoughts are lifted because our gaze is heavenward. As we consider His glory our yearning for Him occupies our hearts.

Life's trials might leave us feeling weak and disheartened, but verse 26 reminds us that even in our weakest moments, God's strength remains constant. When our own strength falters, God steps in as the anchor that steadies us.

and my portion forever."

Patriot Day, holiday observed in the United States on September 11 to commemorate the lives of those who died in the 2001 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center in New York City and the Pentagon in Virginia and those who perished when the hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Pennsylvania. The holiday also recognizes those who died attempting to rescue people trapped by the attacks.

By a joint resolution of the U.S. Congress on Dec. 18, 2001, September 11 was designated as Patriot Day. The resolution calls for the president of the United States to issue a yearly proclamation requesting that all U.S. flags be flown at half-staff. Further, Americans are asked to honour the dead with a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 AM, Eastern Standard Time, the time that the first airplane struck the World Trade Center, and to respect the ceremonies of remembrance when they are conducted. Prior to passage of the resolution, several other names had been proposed for the day, such as the National Day of Remembrance and the National Day of Prayer and Remembrance. *—-https://www.britannica.com/topic/PatriotDay*





Hymns and Where They Came From

"I Need Thee Every Hour"

♪ I need Thee ev'ry hour, Most gracious Lord; No tender voice like Thine can peace afford.

♪ I need Thee ev'ry hour, Stay Thou nearby; Temptations lose their pow'r When Thou art nigh.

♪ I need Thee ev'ry hour, In joy or pain; Come quickly, and abide, Or life is vain.

♪ I need Thee ev'ry hour, Teach me Thy will, And Thy rich promises In me fulfill.

♪ I need Thee, O I need Thee; Ev'ry hour I need Thee! O bless me now, my Savior, I come to Thee.

–Annie Sherwood Hawks (1835-1918), Robert Lowry (1826-1899), refrain

You don't often think of hymns being written by thirty-seven-year-old homemakers from Brooklyn, but that's the story of this hymn. Annie Hawks was busy with her household chores when the words came to her. She later wrote, "I was so filled with a sense of nearness to my Master that, wondering how one could live without Him in either joy or pain, these words, 'I need thee every hour,' were flashed into my mind. Seating myself by the open window in the balmy air of the bright June day, I caught up my pencil and the words were soon committed to paper."

The pastor of her Baptist church was a musician, and he put the words to music. Two years later Dwight L. Moody and Ira Sankey discovered the song, and it became famous, much to the amazement of Annie Hawks.

Hawks reflected, "It was not until years later, when the shadow fell over my way, the shadow of a great loss, that I understood something of the comforting power in the words." God often allows us to learn in the sunshine what we will need to lean on in the darkness.

WHAT IS ROSH HASHANAH?

What: Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the universe, the day $G \Box d$ created Adam and Eve, and it's celebrated as the head of the Jewish year.

When: Rosh Hashanah is observed on the first two days of the Jewish new year, Tishrei 1 and 2, beginning at sundown on the eve of Tishrei 1. Rosh Hashanah 2023 begins at sundown on September 15 and continues through nightfall on September 17

How: Rosh Hashanah is celebrated with candle lighting in the evenings, festive meals with sweet delicacies during the night and day, prayer services that include the sounding of the ram's horn *(shofar)* on both mornings, and desisting from creative work. See our calendar for details.

The Jewish New Year, Rosh Hashanah actually means "Head of the Year." Just like the head controls the body, our actions on Rosh Hashanah have a tremendous impact on the rest of the year.

As we read in the Rosh Hashanah prayers, each year on this day "all inhabitants of the world pass before $G \square d$ like a flock of sheep," and it is decreed in the heavenly court "who shall live, and who shall die ... who shall be impoverished and who shall be enriched; who shall fall and who shall rise."

It is a day of prayer, a time to ask the Almighty to grant us a year of peace, prosperity and blessing. But it is also a joyous day when we proclaim $G \square d$ King of the Universe.

Yom Kippur In Brief


What: Yom Kippur fast day is the holiest day of the year, when we are closest to $G \square d$ and to the essence of our souls. Yom Kippur means "Day of Atonement," as

the verse states, "For on this day He will forgive you, to purify you, that you be cleansed from all your sins before $G\Box d$."1


When: The 10th day of Tishrei (in 2023, from several minutes before sunset on Sunday, September 24, until after nightfall on Monday, September 25), coming on the heels of Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year, which is on the first and second days of Tishrei).

How: For nearly 26 hours we "afflict our souls": we abstain from food and drink, do not wash or apply lotions or creams, do not wear leather footwear, and abstain from marital relations. Instead, we spend the day in synagogue, praying for forgiveness.


