I want to thank everyone who has joined me in prayer asking the Lord to preserve my vision. I am happy to report that I have had my first treatments and my second round is at the end of June. I am getting shots of Syfovre in each eye. (Syfovre is a new treatment for Macular Degeneration). The drug is designed to slow the rate of degeneration. Fortunately for me I know a savior who specializes in "eye problems".

I can't pass up the opportunity to share some thoughts from scripture related to eyes. Matthew 6:22-23 states, "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are healthy, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness!" These verses hold profound applications for Christians in their spiritual journey.

Pure and Focused. It is essential that believers maintain a pure and focused heart. The "eye" symbolizes our perception and desires. As Christians, we are called to guard our hearts against worldly influences that can lead us astray from God's truth. By keeping our eyes healthy, fixed on God's Word and His will, we allow His light to guide us and illuminate our path.

Spiritual Discernment. Matthew 6:22-23 highlights the significance of spiritual perception. Our eyes can be a gateway to our souls, and what we choose to focus on greatly affects our spiritual well-being. It calls Christians to evaluate the nature of the things they expose themselves to—whether they are promoting godliness or darkness. Through prayer, Bible study, and seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance, believers can cultivate discernment and make wise choices that align with God's principles. Spiritual Darkness Has consequences. If we allow ourselves to be consumed by worldly values, our spiritual vitality diminishes, and our ability to perceive God's truth weakens. It emphasizes the need for Christians to be vigilant and strive for spiritual health continually.

Invaluable applications. Matthew 6:22-23 urges believers to guard their hearts, cultivate spiritual discernment, and avoid the darkness of worldly influences. I pray that each of us will walk in the light of God's truth, experiencing His guidance and experiencing a thriving relationship with Him.


Also, be in prayer that God will provide the right place for him that is close enough that he can still be a part of our church fellowship and services.




CHURCH NOTICE & HELP NEEDED

Then the farmer added, "But Lord, when you mix them all together and bake them, I do love warm fresh biscuits. So Lord, when




