A Word of Hope: Trusting the Known God with an Unknown Future

September often brings a sense of transition. Summer begins to fade, school routines return, and calendars fill with plans, responsibilities, and decisions. For some, this month feels exciting and full of possibility. For others, it may bring uncertainty, weariness, or questions about what lies ahead.

In every season of change, believers are invited to remember this steady truth: while the future may be unknown to us, it is never unknown to God. He sees the road ahead. He knows our needs before we ask. He remains faithful when circumstances feel uncertain.

“Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God.” — Corrie ten Boom

Corrie ten Boom was a Dutch Christian watchmaker from Haarlem, the Netherlands, whose family helped

hide and rescue Jewish people during World War II.

Because of their work with the Dutch resistance, Corrie and members of her family were arrested in 1944; she later survived imprisonment, including time at Ravensbrück concentration camp. After the war, she became a writer and speaker, sharing a message of forgiveness, courage, and hope in Christ through her well-known memoir *The Hiding Place*.

Corrie ten Boom knew what it meant to trust God in difficult and uncertain days. Her words remind us that faith is not confidence in knowing every detail of tomorrow. Faith is confidence in the character of the One who holds tomorrow.

Scripture gives us the same assurance: “Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths” (Proverbs 3:5–6).

We see this same kind of trust in Abraham. When God called him to leave his country and go to a land he had not yet seen, Abraham obeyed, not because he had a map of the future, but because he trusted the God who was leading him. Hebrews 11:8 tells us that “by faith Abraham obeyed” and went, even though he did not know where he was going. His story reminds us that God’s guidance is often given one faithful step at a time.

In that same spirit, as we enter September, let us bring our plans, questions, families, ministries, worries, and hopes before the Lord. We do not need to have every answer before we take the next faithful step. We can trust the God who has carried us this far to continue guiding us with wisdom, grace, and love.

This month may our church family walk forward with renewed hope—not because the future is perfectly clear, but because our God is perfectly faithful.

God loves you and so do I!!!

Wisdom is a Realm

Back in April, we explored the connection of Jesus to wisdom as He is declared to be "the wisdom of God." Solomon portrays wisdom as a woman, who walks, talks, and encourages men and women to explore the truths of wisdom. Wisdom is personified again in the person of Jesus. The truth of wisdom becomes fulfilled, becoming clear eventually in Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension to heaven.

Today, we will explore Solomon teaching that wisdom was God's first act of creation in Proverbs 8:22. Being first meant that the spiritual realm and the physical realm was not made yet. Earlier in Proverbs in 3:19, Solomon, through the Holy Spirit, says that wisdom is foundational to earth's creation. The foundation of all of creation is wisdom. The creation order is wisdom, then the spiritual (as angels - sons of God - observed earth's creation in Job 38:4-7), and lastly the physical realm and earth was made.

What this means is that there was a time when only God and wisdom existed. Proverbs 8:30 tells us that at this time when it was only God and wisdom that wisdom regularly "delighted" God. Wisdom made God happy. Implied in this Hebrew term for "delight" is the idea of dance. Wisdom in the NASB translation in this same verse says that wisdom was a "master builder." I presume that wisdom was active helping God plan and design the realms of the spiritual and the physical that were to follow. But even better is that we can presume that wisdom made God smile.

So, while Solomon identifies the active creation force helping God in creation as wisdom, Paul identifies this force being Jesus as he declares in Colossians 1:16 that Jesus made all things. Wisdom and Jesus are connected as Jesus is the wisdom of God (I Corinthians 1:25). Jesus fulfilled the teachings of Solomon as He is fulfilled wisdom.

Being a foundation makes wisdom different than the realms of the spiritual and the physical. Wisdom is unique as the first act of God in the creation process. Wisdom is the bridge from God to all that was created later. Note that Jesus is God. Jesus is wisdom. And Jesus is human being fully flesh and blood.

If I haven't gotten your attention or interest in the previous teachings on wisdom, I am sure I have your attention now. Wisdom being a realm, the first act of God creation, and God's delight gives us something to think about.

Abide

Jesus' last act before leaving the Upper Room was to pray...imagine that Church! Before ascending to Gethsemane & onto His destined reservation at Golgotha, Jesus sought out the intimacy & strengthening of The Father! In John 17, the true "LORD's Prayer",

Jesus prays first & foremost to the Father for His Transfiguration, His Glorification back to the right hand of the Father. The

Son comes Home!

Then He prays for the Twelve, and finally He prays for you, and finally He prays for you & me, us, His Body, the Church! In verse three Jesus gives His definition of eternal life. "Now this is eternal life; that they know You, the Only True GOD & Jesus Christ Whom You have sent." The root of the Greek word transliterated as "know" implies a most intimate, personal, and ongoing, growing relational knowledge. It's just that simple! GOD desires the deepest, most meaningful kinship, fellowship with His children.

So what's my response? What is the key, on my part, to the highest fulfillment of this intimacy? I believe Jesus provides those answers in John 15:1-11. In the last of His seven major "I Am" statements, Jesus says, "I Am the True Vine...If you abide in Me & I in you, you will bear much fruit!" Abide is the key, the linchpin. This passage is from the middle of His Upper Room Discourse, chapters 13-17 in John's Gospel.

This section is a sea of red.

in a red-letter edition of the Bible, highlighting Jesus' words in red. Jesus goes all-access to His disciples for the last time before He is resurrected.

As we study this passage, let's pay specific attention to the usage, scope & meaning of the action verb abide, or meno in the Koine Greek. This word exhorts one to remain, stay, cleave, dwell... But where?? Not where, but who! ...Jesus Christ...In Christ Alone... Solo Christus!

Now let us study GOD's Holy Word—John 15:1-11.

- 1) "I Am The True Vine & My Father the Vinedresser."
- 2) "Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit, He takes away; & every branch that bears fruit, He prunes it so it will bear more fruit."
- 3) "You are already clean because of the Word I spoke to you."
- 4) "Abide in Me & I in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit itself unless it abides in the vine. Neither can you unless you abide in Me."
- 5) "I am the vine & you are the branches; he who abides in Me & I in him bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing!"





6) "If anyone does not abide in Me, he is thrown away as a branch & dries up; & they cast them into the fire & they are burned."

7) "If you abide in Me & My Words abide in you, ask whatever you wish & it will be granted unto you."

8) "My Father is glorified by this: that you bear much fruit."

9) "Just as the Father has loved Me, I have loved you; abide in My love."

10) "If you keep My Commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept My Father's Commandments & abide in His love." I don't normally print out the entire main expository passage, always encouraging actual paper Bible studying along the way. But in doing so with today's text, it provides a very powerful visual image of the importance of abiding in Jesus.

Abide, remain, stay, dwell, live!

By my count the word "abide" appears no less than 8 times in 11 verses; 5 of those times Jesus says, "Abide in Me." So, how is that fleshed out in the spiritual walk of the born-again believer? The answer to that is simply found in a life of vigilant & diligent pursuit of the heart of the King, deeper & more intimately! This is accomplished to perfection in a determined, totally surrendered embracing of the disciplines of our faith: praise, prayer, study of Scripture, serving, giving, missions & fellowship.

In verse 10, Jesus gives the secret to a life of abiding; that is found primarily in the keeping of the Father's

commandments. In John 14:15 Jesus states, "If you love me, obey my commands."

I deliberately left out verse 11 till now: the value & reward of living a life abiding in Christ.

11) "These things have I spoken to you that My joy may be in you & that your joy may be completely full."

Did you hear that Church...double joy! That's the joy of His Good News Gospel. The joy of Calvary!

The joy expressed by the author in Hebrews 12:2, "Who for the joy set before Him endured the Cross!"

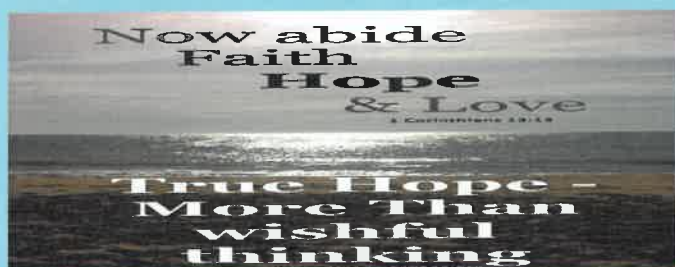
The joy of the restored relationship between GOD & the Crown of His Creation ...joy unspeakable!

TIANEPTINE ("GAS STATION HEROIN")

Arizona Legal Status & Community Guidance

ARIZONA LEGAL STATUS

Arizona has NOT enacted a statewide ban or scheduling of tianeptine as of August 2026. Tianeptine remains LEGALLY purchasable in Arizona at gas stations, convenience stores, vape shops, and online retailers — despite being unregulated and dangerous.

Arizona is not among the 15+ states that have formally banned tianeptine (including Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Ohio, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and Virginia).

Retailers in the Phoenix metro area and across Arizona are actively stocking these products. Note: Arizona's lack of a state ban means local retailers face no state-level penalty for selling these products until federal action is finalized.

FEDERAL ACTIONS

FDA (May 8, 2025): Issued a formal consumer warning — "Do not purchase or use any tianeptine product." Commissioner Makary issued a nationwide alert calling it a "dangerous and growing health trend" targeting youth.

FDA has issued warning letters, import alerts, and demanded product recalls (Neptune's Fix recalled Jan. 2024).

DEA (July 8, 2026): Proposed placing tianeptine in Schedule I of the Controlled Substances Act — same category as heroin. Public comment period closed August 7, 2026. Rule not yet finalized.

Congress: The Pallone-Durbin bill, if passed, would give the FDA authority to prohibit tianeptine marketing nationwide.

No FDA-approved medical use exists in the United States.

KNOWN HEALTH RISKS

- Acts as an opioid receptor agonist at high doses — similar to morphine and fentanyl.
- Severe adverse effects: agitation, confusion, nausea, vomiting, rapid heartbeat, high blood pressure, respiratory depression, coma, and death.
- Seizures and loss of consciousness linked to products like Neptune's Fix.
- Highly addictive: produces opioid-like dependence and brutal withdrawal symptoms.



- Users commonly take doses 1.3 to 250 times the therapeutic dose used in other countries.
- 40% of reported exposures required hospital admission; 23% required critical care.
- CRITICAL: Tianeptine is NOT detected on standard drug screening panels.
- Products may contain unlisted ingredients, including synthetic cannabinoids.

PRODUCT NAMES TO RECOGNIZE

- Street Name: “Gas Station Heroin”
- Marketed as: dietary supplements, nootropics, cognitive enhancers, research chemicals
- Common Brand Names: Zaza · Tianaa · Neptune’s Fix · Pegasus · TD Red
- Sold in: gas stations, convenience stores, vape/smoke shops, and online
- Appearance: liquid elixirs, capsules, powder, and pills — sometimes disguised as vitamins or energy supplements
- Warning: Products are often labeled with wellness claims (mood, focus, energy) — these claims are unproven and illegal under FDA rules.

COUNTY-LEVEL ENFORCEMENT

No Maricopa, Pima, or other Arizona county has enacted its own tianeptine ban.

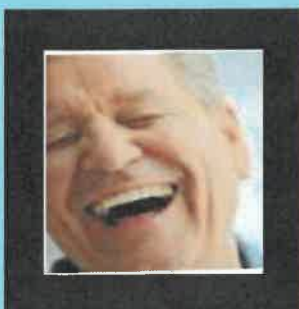
Arizona Poison Control / Banner Poison & Drug Information Center has issued active advisories urging residents to avoid all tianeptine products (as of 2026).

FOX 10 Phoenix (March 30, 2026): Reported on federal MAHA-linked scrutiny of Valley convenience stores and retailers being put “on notice.”

Local retailers are being urged by federal and state health officials to review federal guidance before stocking nootropic or energy elixirs that may contain tianeptine.

Until federal scheduling is finalized, enforcement relies on FDA warning letters and retailer voluntary compliance.

A practical way to save money now

1. Pay yourself first

- Every payday, automatically move **5–10%** into savings.
- Even \$25–\$50 per paycheck makes a difference.

2. Do a 30-day spending check

Look at your last 30 days of bank/credit-card transactions and identify:

- Restaurants/fast food
- Amazon/online shopping
- Subscriptions
- Entertainment
- Unnecessary convenience purchases

The CFPB recommends reviewing your actual spending before creating your budget.

3. Reduce your biggest bills first

Instead of worrying about saving \$2 on coffee, look at:

- Car insurance
- Cell phone
- Internet
- Auto payment
- Rent/housing
- Credit-card interest

Even a \$50/month reduction saves **\$600 per year**.

4. Build an emergency fund

Start with **\$1,000**, then work toward **1 month of essential expenses**. Even a small emergency fund can help you avoid using credit cards or loans when something unexpected happens.

5. Use a “24-hour rule”

For anything you want but don't need, wait 24 hours before buying it. For expensive purchases, wait a week.

6. Separate your savings

Have a savings account that isn't connected to your everyday spending. Automatic transfers can make saving much easier.

A simple example

If you take home **\$4,000/month**, you could start with:

- \$200 → emergency savings
- \$100 → additional debt payment
- \$3,700 → living expenses and bills

That's **\$2,400 saved in one year** if you consistently save \$200/month.

Best strategy to improve my financial situation

1. **Stop adding new debt**, especially credit-card debt.
2. **Create a simple monthly budget** for housing, food, transportation, insurance, and debt payments.
3. **Build a small emergency fund** — start with \$500, then work toward \$1,000.
4. **Pay off high-interest debt** as aggressively as you can.
5. Once you're stable, start investing gradually through a **401(k), IRA, or diversified investments**, depending on your situation. Keep emergency savings in a **high-yield savings account** rather than leaving everything in a checking account.

Most important

Don't wait until the situation becomes overwhelming. If you're struggling with payments, **contact creditors before missing payments** and ask about hardship programs or payment arrangements
