# The Power of Confession and Prayer

I love it when people refer to Crossroads as a loving and praying church! It is the highest praise because it clearly testifies that we are God focused and relationship-oriented people. I might add that it is indicative of obedient people.

James 5:16 says, "Therefore confess your sins to each other and

pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

Here we see something of the transformative power of confession and prayer in the life of a believer. Let's explore three key points from this verse.

**1. Confession Brings Healing:** Confession is more than admitting our wrongs; it's a step towards healing. When we confess our sins to one another, we break the chains of secrecy and guilt. This openness fosters a supportive community where healing can begin. As Proverbs 28:13 says, "Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy."

**2. Prayer Strengthens Relationships:** Praying for each other builds a bond of unity and love within the church. It shifts our focus from ourselves to the needs of others, fostering empathy and compassion. This mutual intercession strengthens our relationships and creates a supportive spiritual family.

**3. Righteous Prayer is Powerful:** The prayer of a righteous person is not just a ritual; it is powerful and effective. When we live in alignment with God's will, our prayers carry weight. They can bring about change, healing, and miracles. As 1 John 5:14-15 reminds us, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

## 🕆 Our Faith in Action 🕆

Crossroads routinely prays for our sick and for those who are lost and need the light of salvation.

Recently, we have incorporated "prayer cards" into our program. A prayer card is a confirming card that we send to the family member who asked us to pray for a loved one needing salvation. Each Wednesday during the prayer and Bible study, our prayer warriors take a few names to pray for. They then fill out the prayer cards and give them to the Crossroads office who then send them to the requester for encouragement. In this way, families are being notified that we have been faithful to their trust and their prayer request is not forgotten.

We have received several calls from families telling us that our faithfulness in prayer has been inspirational and encourages their hearts.

If you would participate in this ministry, the cards are on a back table in the information area. Pray for the named person(s) on the card, fill out the card, and put them in the outgoing box.



## Crossing Fingers: What Does It Mean and How Did it Start?

Most people cross their fingers when they need luck, either for themselves or for someone else. The same urge can also be felt when someone needs protection or even divine intervention.

Occasionally, even children will cross their fingers behind their backs in an attempt to invalidate a promise or to tell a white lie.

It's clear that crossing your fingers has a couple of meanings. It's a gesture that invites luck, but it's also a gesture that demonstrates a lie. So where did this practice originate from and why do we still do it?

#### The Meaning of Crossing Fingers

There are two primary theories on how crossing fingers came to be a symbol of good luck.

#### Links to Christianity

The first can be traced to <u>pagan</u> times in Western Europe where the cross was highly accepted as a <u>symbol of unity</u>. It was also believed that good spirits lived at the cross's intersection. It is at this intersection where a person must anchor his or her wishes until they come true.

The practice of wishing upon a cross spread across the early European cultures during pre-Christian times. This is also similar to the practice of saying *touch wood* or knocking on wood to negate bad luck – which is also associated with the cross.

As time evolved, well-wishing individuals began crossing their index fingers over the index finger of the person asking for a wish to come true. In this case, two fingers make a cross; the one asking for a wish and the one supporting and empathizing.

Crossing fingers over centuries became much simpler. A person could now make his or her wish by merely crossing his or her index and middle fingers to make an "X".

The cross could already be made without requiring a supporter. Friends and family, however, can still commiserate by crossing their own fingers or at the very least saying "Keep your fingers crossed."

#### **Early Christianity**

Other explanations of origin can be found during the early Christian era. In those times, Christians crossed their fingers in order to invoke the powers associated with the Christian cross.

As Christians were persecuted by Romans in the early Church, the crossed fingers and the <u>Ichthys</u> (fish) came to symbolize assembly for worship services or a way to recognize fellow Christians and interact safely.

#### To Ward Off Bad Luck

Some accounts suggest that people crossed their fingers during 16th century England to ward off evil spirits. People also crossed their fingers if someone sneezed or coughed. Like the practice of saying *bless you* when someone sneezed, this may have been because people would worry about the health of the person who had sneezed and wished God's mercy and blessings on them.

#### Why Do We Cross Our Fingers When Lying?

Stories on how crossing fingers when lying came to be are mixed.

Some say that this gesture of crossing fingers when lying may have come from Christianity. This is because one of the Ten Commandments says do not lie or more accurately "do not testify falsely against your neighbor."

Despite breaking one of God's commandments, Christians are believed to have made the cross symbol using their fingers in order to keep God's wrath at bay.

As early Christians were persecuted, they would also cross their fingers when lying about their faith, as a way to ask God for protection and forgiveness.
