Left alone, I thought nobody cared, and I hung out on the street with other neglected kids. We broke into a storage place and stole a bunch of stuff,

and because Mom couldn't supervise me, the judge sent me to reformatory.

At thirteen I was arrested and sent to my second reform school. Finally, at fifteen I went home again. By then I was hardened, impervious to Mom's pleas and prayers. I worked some, drank a lot and burrowed deeper into crime, mostly burglaries. A multiple loser, I spent time in San Quentin, but it was in Folsom, facing years behind bars that I felt despair. Scripture Mother had taught me kept infiltrating my mind. I began reading the Bible.

Night after night I sat by the door where a sliver of light came through and read that Bible. Night after night, and the Light of the world penetrated the darkness in my soul. I cried out to God, asking Him to reveal Himself to me. God will answer a sincere prayer because He sure answered mine. I could see Jesus, bloody and hanging on the cross for me — for me, a thief. And I said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner and save me for Jesus' sake." And He set me free of my prison of selfishness. When I was released, I went back into prison to share God's love.
