Jesus is saying that the worldly way of leadership is that leaders will lord it over other people and they will exert their power. Yet the godly way is that if you want to be first, then you should become the slave and if you want to lead, you will actually need to serve people.

I believe that Jesus has called us to lead, which means that we should be serving others. That is God's way. The scripture goes on to say, 'For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others.'
