- 5. What are some of your favorite excuses for justified sin in your life? Are there any patterns in your life by which you tend to "make... provision for the flesh" [Rom. 13:14]?
- 6. In light of Matthew 5:29-30, what are some practical ways for us to take radical action towards dealing with sin in our lives?
