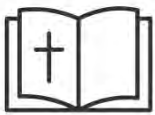

Sermon: *The Bread of Life (Part 1)*

Sermon: *The miracle meal Jesus performed for the 5000 wasn't enough for the hungry crowd. They worked hard to find Jesus across the shore in Capernaum. They were looking for Jesus because of the physical bread he could provide but He came down from heaven to be the Spiritual bread that gives eternal life. Jesus is the bread of life and the only way for our souls to be satisfied in Him is to believe in Him. Jesus came to do the will of the Father and the will of the Father is to bring people to the Son so that we might have eternal life.*

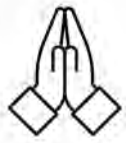


Key Passage: John 6:22-40

Questions for discussion:

1. What stood out to you from the sermon/passage?
2. What was the motivation of the crowds to find Jesus?
3. What was your default motivation in life before encountering Christ?
4. What is the work God requires of us to be saved? (John 6:27)
5. What are the similarities and differences between Jesus and manna? (6:30-34)
6. Why does Jesus call himself the Bread of Life?
7. Who can "eat" the Bread of Life and how? (6:33, 35)
8. Why do we naturally desire the things of the world rather than the things of God? (6:36)
9. Why can't we come to Jesus on our own and see Him as the Bread of Life? (John 3:3, 6:37, 6:44)
10. How do we know our salvation is secure in Christ? (John 6:39, Rom. 8:28-30, Phil. 1:6,)
11. Based on this passage, what is God's will for your life? (6:40).

Prayer Prompts



- Pray for those who have not yet encountered Jesus as the Bread of Life.
- Pray for your daily bread to be found in Jesus more than physical bread.
- Pray for continued reliance on the Holy Spirit to be satisfied in Christ alone.
- Pray against the temptation to find satisfaction in the world rather than God.
