The Holy Spirit, however, when he illuminates their minds, leads us to see that Jehovah is God, and beside him there is none else. Gospel in the Culture

<u>Secretary of State Marco Rubio</u> (his closing remarks at Charlie Kirk's Memorial Service)

Kingdom Parables

Kingdom of God

- = a realm, not like on earth
- = wherever God's light and royal will is reigning
- = includes the Church, but it's more



Parable

(Greek: parabole)

- = comparison ~ metaphor ~ picture ~ illustration
- = concrete depiction of a cosmic truth
- = a story with symbolic, spiritual meaning
