

John 1:1-9, 19-28

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. 4 In him was life, and the life was the light of men. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. 8 He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.




#### WE COME TO HIS TABLE

#### QUESTION FROM TIM: WILL YOU GIVE THIS DECEMBER?

Friends,

Will you prayerfully consider giving sacrificially to All Saints this December through a financial gift?

We have just entered Advent, a time of expectation and preparation to celebrate Christmas. Advent anticipates and Christmas celebrates what the Apostle Paul proclaims in Philippians 2: "Christ Jesus... did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of man." What love! What grace!

How are we to respond to such an infinitely prodigal act as the Incarnation? Reverence. Wonder. Action. This was the shepherds' response in hearing of Jesus' birth: "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened..." (Luke 2:15). Joy. Worship. Giving. This too was the wise men's response: "They fell down and worshipped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh" (Matt 2:11). How will we respond this year to God emptying Himself?

Pastors ponder questions like this right now, because it's not just the beginning of a new Church Year; it's also the end of the calendar year. And our budget for next year (and plans for ministry and mission) is largely determined over the next few weeks.

What will ministry and mission look like at All Saints in 2018? Will we continue to support our many ministry partners as planned? Will we be able to set aside funds for local church planting? Will we be able to continue all the ministry programs the Lord has used at All Saints over the years or the ones initiated this past year? Will we be able to hire any new staff or initiate any new ministry programs? This month, December 2017, will tell us.

Through November, our church has sacrificially given \$1,634,000 this year to the General Fund. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! That's a 5% increase from 2016. However, our church body has grown by more than that. And with new people come new needs and a growing budget. Last December, our general fund received \$555,000. This December, I'm praying we'll receive \$900,000 in order to maintain our current programming levels. By God's self-emptying grace, it is possible for us.

Will you join me in that "sacrifice of praise" initiated by the wise men who were the first to open their treasures and lay them at the feet of our Incarnate Lord?

Many of you have asked **if All Saints is planning a new capital campaign to build additional facilities for our church.** Our final sanctuary? Maybe. The church leadership, our architects, and I have been working on various plans and scenarios for how/if we take that step. Much of our campus is stretched at the seams, especially on Sundays.

But I want to make sure the timing is right and that we, as a church, are willing and able to "count the cost" and sing the "sacrifice of praise" that a new capital campaign would require. This December's giving will indicate our church's readiness and the Lord's leading in this potential endeavor.

If you haven't made tithing or sacrificial giving a practice, please consider doing so that together we might increase All Saints' capacity to be the body of Christ in Austin for the world. A quarter of All Saints members have not given financially to the church, and **we need everyone's participation to fund the ongoing work of God's Kingdom through All Saints.** 

As always, **thank you for giving sacrificially to the ministry and mission of All Saints.** It is such a privilege to be your senior pastor for another year! My hope and sincere prayer is that we would all, as a community, be prepared this Advent to "go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened."

Come, Lord Jesus, Come!
