Jesus is....

- A. The Word (v. 1)
- B. The Word was God (v. 1)
- C. In the beginning with God (v.2)
- D. All things were made through him (v.2)
- E. The light of men (v. 4)
- F. The true light (v. 9)
- G. Not received by his own people (v. 11)
- H. The world was made through Jesus (v. 10).

Yet....

A. The Word (described in John 1:1-13) became flesh and dwelt among us.



- A. Jesus comes from the Father, so we have seen the glory of God (v. 14).
- B. Jesus is full of grace and truth (v. 14)
- C. From Jesus we receive grace upon grace (v. 16)
- D. Grace and truth come through Jesus (v. 17)
  - E. Jesus has made God known (v. 18)

Behold, the Lamb of God (v29) and v. 36.

This is the Son of God (v. 34)

Rabbi or Teacher (v. 38)

The Messiah (v. 41)

Jesus of Nazareth, son of Joseph (v. 45)

King of Israel (v. 49)

A. Those who believed are given the right to become children of God (1:12)

I am not the Christ (1:20)

Men bear witness to Christ (1:6, 27, 32, 34)

Now an astounding phrase comes in John 2:23-25, speaking about those who believed after seeing the signs he was doing.

--Jesus did not entrust himself to them (2:24)

Why?

--Because Jesus knew all people (2:24)

--Jesus needed no one to bear witness to man (2:25)

Why?

--Jesus knew what was in man (2:25)

Sobering.

What to do with this truth?

--Unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God (3:3)

The Surprising Conclusion

God so loved the world....(3:16)

Wait...what?

In view of John 1:1-3:15, the next sentence is not what we see coming....

We even learn more.

- People loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil (3:19)
- Many hate the light because their works will be exposed (3:20)
- I am not the Christ (via John) (3:28)

Jesus must increase; we must decrease (3:30)

Jesus is above all (3:31)
