<u>Summary</u>

- After King Solomon died (931 BC), the Israel monarchy split into Northern & Southern Kingdoms—Israel & Judea.
- Jerusalem was the capital city and worship center for Judea.
- Samaria became the capital city and worship center for Israel.

<u>Summary</u>

- After King Solomon died (931 BC), the Israel monarchy split into Northern & Southern Kingdoms—Israel & Judea.
- Jerusalem was the capital city and worship center for Judea.
- Samaria became the capital city and worship center for Israel.
- After Assyria conquered Israel (721 BC), many of these Israelis were taken to Assyria as captives, but some remained in the land and intermarried with foreigners left there by the Assyrians. These half-Jewish, half-Gentile people became known as the Samaritans.

- 70 years after Babylon conquered Judah, exiled the Jews, and destroyed the Jerusalem Temple in 586 B.C., Nehemiah (a Jew) returned to rebuild the Temple and its city walls.
- OT books of Ezra & Nehemiah chronicle this rebuilding, and mention Samaritans by name for the first time because they oppose rebuilding efforts (Neh 6.1-14). This began a long-lasting hatred between Jews and Samaritans. ... But why? ...

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- As a mix of spiritually corrupt Israelites and pagan foreigners, Samaritans created their own religion which the Jews considered heresy.


- Samaritans centered their temple worship on Mt. Gerizim, where they claimed Moses originally wanted Israel to worship
- Samaritans had their own version of the Pentateuch (first 5 books written by Moses) and rejected the Prophets and Jewish traditions.
- Samaritans believed that they were the true descendants of Israel, preservers of Israel's true religion, and that the Jerusalem Temple and its priesthood were illegitimate.

<u>**Church History**</u>—Q₃₁b—...the Samaritans ...?</sub>

- And so, when Jews returned from Babylonian exile to rebuild the Temple and Jerusalem, Samaritans opposed them.
- Jews saw Samaritans as more revolting than Gentiles (pagans)
 - Samaritans survived in the land through the time of Jesus.
 - (Several 100 Samaritans still live & worship in Israel today.)

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 - Luke 10.25-37 The Good Samaritan (Jerusalem to Jericho)
 - John 4 The Woman at the Well (Judea to Galilee)
