- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 354 430 AD Augustine< almost 800 years >
  - 1225 1274 AD Aquinas
  - 430-460 AD Patrick introduces Christianity to Ireland
  - 440 AD Leo the Great became Bishop of Rome
    - Roman Papacy
  - 451 AD Council of Chalcedon (4<sup>th</sup> ecumenical)
    - "Chalcedonian Definition" Christology—
      - The Incarnation resulted in 2 natures (deity & humanity) in 1 person (Jesus Christ).
      - God is 3 "whos" (persons) & 1 "what" (nature).
      - Jesus Christ is 1 "who" (person) & 2 "whats" (nature).

- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 476 "Fall of Rome" begins
     [1453 "Fall of Rome" ends; Constantinople falls to Islam]
  - 450 1000 AD The "Dark Ages"

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  - 450 1000 AD The "Dark Ages"
  - 480-543 Benedict of Nursia, father of Monasticism

- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 529 Synod or Orange
    - Rejected John <u>Cassian</u>'s "Semi-Pelagianism"
    - Declined to affirmed Augustine's Monergism
    - Affirmed "Semi-Augustinianism" to explain salvation
  - 540-604 Gregory the Great (Gregory I)
    - 590 named "Pope" above all other Bishops
    - End of the Federation of Bishops
    - Singular Leader over all the Church (West & East)
    - Stepped into the power void left by the "Fall of Rome" to also become the effective civil, political and military leader in the West


- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 610 Muhammad (d. 632) starts receiving "revelations"
     [~8<sup>th</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> C. "Islamic Golden Age"]
  - Monotheletism
    - Christ did not have 1 nature, but 1 *will*, which was divine
  - 680-681 Council of Constantinople (6<sup>th</sup> ecumenical)
    - Condemned Monotheletism
    - Affirmed Christ had a human will & nature and a divine will & nature.

- Augustine to Aquinas
  - Iconoclasm Controversy
    - Emperor Leo III ordered icons destroyed
  - 675-749 John of Damascus (Eastern Orthodox Church)
    - "... I make an image of the God whom I see. I do <u>not</u> <u>worship</u> matter; I worship the God of matter .... I <u>venerate</u> it, though not as God."
    - Icons are venerated (honored, respected) because of whom they represent, but they are not worshipped—only God is worshipped. Just as we create pictures of humans to represent them, we create pictures of Jesus to represent him. Denying icons denies the Incarnation.
    - 787 Council of Nicea (7<sup>th</sup> ecumenical)
      - Exonerated the proper use of icons
      - Condemned the Iconoclasts ("icon-emashers")

- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 800 Pope Leo III crowned the French King, Charles
    - a/k/a Charlemagne (Charles the Great)
    - Began the Holy Roman Empire—a close association between church and state in the Middle Ages of Europe
  - 1000 Europe was "Christianized" and stabilized politically
  - 1123 1<sup>st</sup> Lateran Council Priests forbidden to marry
  - 1054 Great Schism Christ's Church splits (east & west)
     due to theological and cultural differences

- Augustine to Aquinas
  - 1093 Anselm becomes Archbishop of Canturbury
    - Launched Scholastic Theology
       —adding the evidence of reason to Scripture
    - "I do not seek to understand in order to believe, but I believe in order that I may understand."
    - Ontological Argument for God's Existence
    - Satisfaction View for Christ's Atonement

- Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274 AD)
- Italian aristocrat family ...
   early Benedictine education
- After Dominican vows, was imprisoned by family
- Ordained a priest in 1250
- Began teaching at University of Paris in 1256
- Scholastic Theologian
- Died at 49
