#### Introduction

Proverbs 3.5-6

#### Exodus

**4**<sup>:18</sup> Moses went back to Jethro his father-in-law and said to him, "Please let me go back to my brothers in Egypt to see whether they are still alive." And Jethro said to Moses, "Go in peace." <sup>19</sup> And the LORD said to Moses in Midian, "Go back to Egypt, for all the men who were seeking your life are dead." <sup>20</sup> So Moses took his wife and his sons and had them ride on a donkey, and went back to the land of Egypt. And Moses took the staff of God in his hand.

<sup>21</sup> And the LORD said to Moses, "When you go back to Egypt, see that you do before Pharaoh all the miracles that I have put in your power. But I will harden his heart, so that he will not let the people go. <sup>22</sup> Then you shall say to Pharaoh, 'Thus says the LORD, Israel is my firstborn son, <sup>23</sup> and I say to you, "Let my son go that he may serve me." If you refuse to let him go, behold, I will kill your firstborn son.'"

<sup>24</sup> At a lodging place on the way the LORD met him and sought to put him to death. <sup>25</sup> Then Zipporah took a flint and cut off her son's foreskin and touched Moses'<sup>[C]</sup> feet with it and said, "Surely you are a bridegroom of blood to me!" <sup>26</sup> So he let him alone. It was then that she said, "A bridegroom of blood," because of the circumcision.

<sup>27</sup> The LORD said to Aaron, "Go into the wilderness to meet Moses." So he went and met him at the mountain of God and kissed him. <sup>28</sup> And Moses told Aaron all the words of the LORD with which he had sent him to speak, and all the signs that he had commanded him to do. <sup>29</sup> Then Moses and Aaron went and gathered together all the elders of the people of Israel. <sup>30</sup> Aaron spoke all the words that the LORD had spoken to Moses and did the signs in the sight of the people. <sup>31</sup> And the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD had visited the people of Israel and that he had seen their affliction, they bowed their heads and worshiped.

### <u>4.18</u>

When God clarifies your life plans, communicate it very carefully to others.

Life transition calls for wisdom, grace and peace where possible with family and employer.

Life <u>flows</u> in the midst of <u>God's will</u>.

### <u>4.19-20a</u>

God cares for your personal concerns and meets your needs.

### <u>4.20b</u>

Things of yours that you use to follow God's call become His / sacred.

Weak things can accomplish great things with God's strength behind them.

## 4.21

Our job is not to explain God's will; our job is to obey it.

### <u>4.22-23</u>

Matthew 3.17

God has two sons, one begotten and one adopted, but both beloved.

## 4.24-26

Engaging in God's <u>work</u> without following God's <u>commands</u> yields God's <u>correction</u>. Not every sickness is <u>from God</u>, but <u>some are</u>.

Listen when your <u>spouse/friend</u> speaks truth in love to <u>reveal</u> areas of spiritual <u>neglect</u>.
