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- Church History is a study in God's people responding to (heretical) teaching in the Church







# What is the "Filioque"





The Great Schism of 1054 divided the whole Church—West (Roman Catholic) & East (Eastern Orthodox)—largely based on whether the Nicene Creed (325) should say "...the Holy Spirit...who proceeds from the Father" only (Eastern view) or "...the Holy Spirit ...who proceeds from the Father and the Son" (Latin: "Filioque"—Western view).






The West wanted to add "and the Son" to the Creed because it's **<u>Biblical</u>**. Before his Crucifixion, Jesus says, "...when the Helper [Holy Spirit] comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father ..." (John 15:26). Paul describes how "...God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts..." (Galatians 4:6), "...the Spirit of Jesus Christ..." (<u>Philippians 1:19</u>). Between his Resurrection and Ascension Jesus said, "...*I am sending* the promise of my Father upon you..." (Luke 24:49), and "Jesus breathed on them and said to them, '*Receive* the Holy Spirit." (John 20:22).





Some Protestants have questioned the importance of the Filioque because it was added to the Creed under the Pope's authority, which Protestants reject. However, the Pope didn't add it simply to flex his Papal muscles; he added it because the Western Church came to realize it was Biblical. Thus, Christians should support the Filioque addition, not based on Papal authority, but because it's Biblical.




#### What Difference the *Filioque* Makes



If the Holy Spirit also proceeds from the Son (the "Logos" – the Word or Logic of God), then our faith or spirituality finds its roots in God's Word, understood through reason. Consequently, the ministerial pursuits of the Western Church have been far more intellectual, relatively. If the Holy Spirit only proceeds from the Father and not the Son (Logos or Word), then our faith or spirituality would come from a more direct encounter with God thru mystical practices rather than reason. Thus, ministerial pursuits of the East have been more mystical than the West.

#### **Difference: Rationalism vs. Mysticism**



#### Western Rationalism



#### Eastern Mysticism

The West has a high view of human reason. Because the Holy Spirit is from the Son (Logos or Wisdom of God), Christians with this Spirit can reason about God. Thus, the West has done far more academic theology than the East. The East is more skeptical about human reason. Faith is more about experiencing God by partaking of God's divine energies.

#### Catholic Age – <u>Seeds of Schism</u>

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- 300-600 Age of Theologians
  - <u>Ecumenical Councils</u>:
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    - Carthage (397) adopts *The Apochrypha* (v. Jerome)
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- 5<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> C. West adds *Filioque* to Nicene Creed (325)
- ~ 476 Rome fell
- 590-604 Pope Gregory I ends Federation of Bishops and begins singular leadership over all the churches
- 7<sup>th</sup> C. Bishop of Rome claims to be superior

#### **Difference: <u>Sacrifice</u>**



## How does THIS save us??

The West believes in Penal Substitutionary

Atonement—Jesus died as a sacrifice to pay the penalty for our sins. The West uses legal terms to describe how we are justified before God.

The East avoids legal terminology and instead speaks about being healed and purified. The East believes Christ defeated death on the Cross and assumed humanity to heal it from sin (which the West also believes).

#### **Difference: Original Sin**



How does THIS affect you?

The West's view of Original Sin comes from Augustine—from the moment of our conception, all of us are guilty of sin from Adam. The West distinguishes between original sin and particular sins we commit—we're guilty for both.

The East says we suffer the effects of sin in this world, but we are not guilty for Adam's sin, and infants are innocent because they have not yet committed any particular sins with their free will.

#### Schism of 1054

- <u>1053</u>
  - Pope Leo IX (Rome) required Greek churches in southern Italy to conform to Latin practices, under threat of closure.
  - Patriarch Michael I (Constantinople) ordered closure of all Latin churches in Constantinople.

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• <u>1054</u>


- Pope Leo sent a Cardinal-led legation to Constantinople to deny Patriarch Michael the title of "ecumenical patriarch" and to insist he recognize Leo's claim as head of all of the churches.
- Upon Michael's refusal, Cardinal Humbert excommunicated him and, in return, Michael excommunicated the Cardinal and legates.

# Western Intellectualism





## **Filioque led to Protestantism**

A fundamental idea in the Protestant Reformation was *SOLA SCRIPTURA* (Latin: *Scripture Alone*)—people can learn to understand the Word of God by the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit. Because the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Son of God (Living *Logos* or Word), then the Spirit can enlighten us to understand the Written *Logos* or Word of God. Before the Protestant Reformation, it was thought that only certain individuals could understand Scripture. But the Reformation said everyone with the Holy Spirit can learn to understand Scripture.
