ADVENT | CHRISTMAS | EPIPHANY | LENT | EASTER | PENTECOST

THE SEASON OF LENT originated as a time of preparation for Easter, spanning 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. The focus of Lent is repentance - a turning of our hearts, minds, and actions from ourselves to God. The Sundays in Lent are *in* the season but not *of* it, and are celebrated as "feast" days, traditionally days on which Lenten fasts are broken as we gather together for worship and to celebrate Christ's resurrection.

THE COLOR OF LENT: Purple, the color of Lent, signifies penitence and humility, and is meant to remind us of humanity's suffering under sin and of Christ's suffering on the cross - the color of a bruise. Purple is also the color of royalty and anticipates the coming glory of Christ's resurrection on Easter.



OLD TESTAMENT READING

GENESIS 19:15-17, 23-38

As morning dawned, the angels urged Lot, saying, "Up! Take your wife and your two daughters who are here, lest you be swept away in the punishment of the city." 16 But he lingered. 

Celebrant: All glory be to you, O Lord our God, for you created heaven and earth, and made us in your own image; and, of your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption.

> He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Therefore, with these your gifts which we now offer you, we your people, celebrate and make the memorial your Son has commanded: When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, until you come again.

Accept this, our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, through which we offer to you our selves, our souls and our bodies. Grant that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction; that Christ may dwell in us, and we in him.

> All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

5. MOBILITY IMPAIRED


If you are unable to come forward and would like communion brought to your seat, please let your usher know and a server will bring the elements to you.

IF YOU'RE STILL INVESTIGATING CHRISTIANITY, NOT SURE WHAT YOU BELIEVE, OR SIMPLY CHOOSE NOT TO PARTICIPATE, YOU MAY EITHER REMAIN IN YOUR SEAT OR COME FORWARD, CROSS YOUR ARMS OVER YOUR CHEST, AND RECEIVE A BLESSING. NON-COMMUNING CHILDREN ARE ENCOURAGED TO COME FORWARD TO RECEIVE A BLESSING WHILE THEIR PARENTS RECEIVE COMMUNION.
