- Church History is a study in God's people responding to (heretical) teaching in the Church
- John 16:7-13—It is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you and ... he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment....<sup>13</sup> When the Spirit of truth comes, **he will guide you into all the truth...**





## Martin Luther's 95 Theses

Fr. Martin Luther sought to *reform* the Church (*"wash its dirty face"*), not to revolt.Instead, his 1517 action got him excommunicated, which began the Protestant Reformation.

- 1056-1106 King Henry IV (Germany) *Investiture Struggle*
- 1020-1085 **Pope Gregory VII (**1073-85) power of *Interdict*
- 1095-1291 "The Crusades" Church: largest landowner
- 1100's Marriage to bishops forbidden for the first time
- 1100-1160 **Peter Lombard** *Sentences:* Catholic theology
- 1224-1274 Thomas Aquinas Summa Theologica
- 1290-1349 Thomas Bradwardine Reformer: Grace precedes.
- 1302 *Unum Sanctum* ("One Church") Papal bull
- 1320-1384 John Wycliffe (English) Translator & Reformer.
- 1372-1415 John Huss (Czech/Bohemian) Radical Reformer
- 1414-1417 Council of Constance 3 popes deposed.
- 1438-1445 Council of Florence 7 Sacraments enumerated.
- 1453-1454 Constantinople fall® Constantinople
- 1452 1455 Johns D/Etemles (Enorgh) Deformer Colos

#### • 1455 – Gutenberg Bible –



- 1483-1546 Martin Luther (German)
  - 1517 (10/31) nailed 95 Theses (Latin propositions, i.e., complaints) on the Wittenberg Church door, including:
    - Power / Authority of the Pope
    - Indulgences "tickets to heaven" to raise money to build St. Peter's Basilica in Rome
    - Purgatory human merit (*The Apochrypha*)
    - Law & Gospel Confusion humans cannot merit what can only be God's grace (unconditional gift)
      - Law = God's demand
      - Gospel = God's gift

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  - 2 <u>Message</u>—'rediscovery of the Gospel'—5 'Solas'—
    - <u>Sola Scriptura</u>—content of salvation; Bible is final authority, even over tradition; its sufficiency;
    - <u>Sola Gratia</u>—means of salvation; finality of provision; priesthood of all believers;
    - <u>Sola Fide</u>—appropriation of salvation; justification by faith alone;
    - <u>Solus Cristus</u>—exclusivity; He alone is the Provider;
    - Soli Deo Gloria—for God's Belonyist Original Asked 6/16/24

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  - Authority was the issue—behind the visible is the invisible hand of the Almighty, who confirmed the canon by the invisible church's affirmation of it
    - The Canon is decided.
    - Reformation's root is Augustine's assertion of predestination—God's grace & man's depravity (which was denied by Lombard and Aquinas)—Jesus died to give us salvation (a certainty), not just to make it possible.

- 1500-1650 Protestant Reformation Overview—
  - <u>2 Approaches to Reform</u>—
    - 1 Magisterial (Lutherans & Calvinists)
       —reform the church; gradual change; endorse state church; accept Christian magistrate concept; infant baptism.
    - 2 Radical (Anabaptists)

—reinstitute the church; immediate change; reject state church; reject Christian magistrate concept; believer's baptism.

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
Lots of other Catholics agreed with Luther . . . . . . But not on everything . . .



#### ... Like the Lord's Supper ...

- Lutherans it's *real physical* Body & Blood of Christ
- Non-Lutherans (Reformed) not so



For example . . .

- Huldrych Zwingli (1483-1546, Swiss) it's not the real, physical body & blood of Christ; it's a meaningful *memorial*
- Peter Vermigli (1499-1562, Italian) it *is* the real body & blood of Christ for those who have *faith*



- 1509-1547 King Henry VIII (English) –
  1527 Pope Clement VII denied his annulment
  - 1529-36 Reformation Parliament




Thomas Cranmer
