ADVENT | CHRISTMAS | EPIPHANY | **LENT** | EASTER | PENTECOST

THE SEASON OF LENT originated as a time of preparation for Easter, spanning 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. The focus of Lent is repentance - a turning of our hearts, minds, and actions from ourselves to God. The Sundays in Lent are *in* the season but not *of* it, and are celebrated as "feast" days, traditionally days on which Lenten fasts are broken as we gather together for worship and to celebrate Christ's resurrection.

THE COLOR OF LENT: Purple, the color of Lent, signifies penitence and humility, and is meant to remind us of humanity's suffering under sin and of Christ's suffering on the cross - the color of a bruise. Purple is also the color of royalty and anticipates the coming glory of Christ's resurrection on Easter.

ROMANS 1:18-25

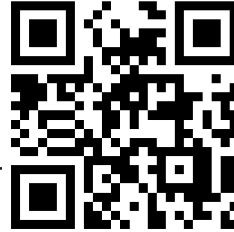

Celebrant: All glory be to you, O Lord our God, for you created heaven and earth, and made us in your own image; and, of your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption.

He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Therefore, with these your gifts which we now offer you, we your people, celebrate and make the memorial your Son has commanded:

Celebrant: We humbly ask you, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with your Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of your dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ. Accept this, our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, through which we offer to you our selves, our souls and our bodies. Grant that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction; that Christ may dwell in us, and we in him.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: *Amen.*

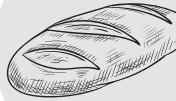


1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

5. MOBILITY IMPAIRED

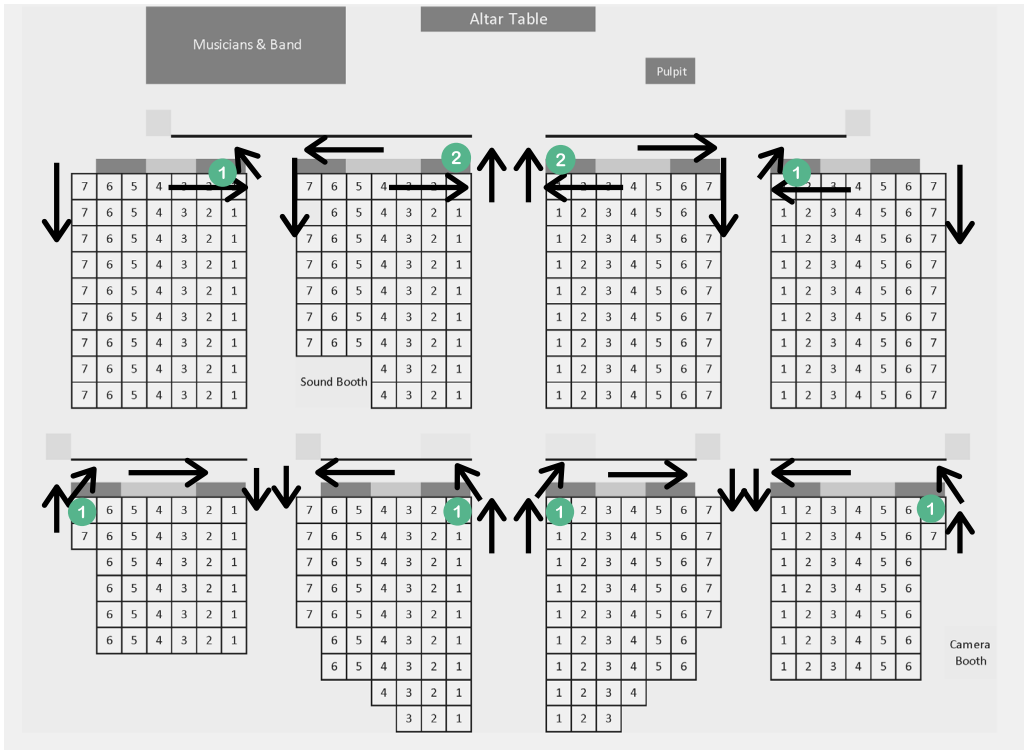
If you are unable to come forward and would like communion brought to your seat, please let your usher know and a server will bring the elements to you.

CHILDREN WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTIZED AND ADMITTED TO THE TABLE BY THE ELDERS OF THIS CHURCH OR THE LEADERSHIP OF ANOTHER CHURCH ARE ALSO WELCOME TO THE TABLE.

IF YOU'RE STILL INVESTIGATING CHRISTIANITY, NOT SURE WHAT YOU BELIEVE, OR SIMPLY CHOOSE NOT TO PARTICIPATE, YOU MAY EITHER REMAIN IN YOUR SEAT OR COME FORWARD, CROSS YOUR ARMS OVER YOUR CHEST, AND RECEIVE A BLESSING.
