Book of Daniel Week One

The overall theme of the book of Daniel is God's sovereignty over all things whether in Babylon or Jerusalem. The book of Daniel was primarily written to the Hebrew population that had been taken into exile during the Babylonian Diaspora. The book is both theological instruction in the faithfulness of God to His covenantal people as well as an exhortation to the Hebrew captives to imitate the faithfulness, wisdom, piety of Daniel and his three friends.

- 1. History of the Book of Daniel.
 - a. Daniel amongst first captives from Judah around the year 607 B.C.
 - b. Daniel 15-16 years old when taken.
 - c. King Jehoiakim (609-597 B.C.) was installed as a puppet king by Pharaoh Neco of Egypt after death of King Josiah.
 - d. Nebuchadnezzar II considered one of the greatest kings of ancient times. He ruled 605-562 B.C.
 - e. Israelites were captive for approximately 70 years.
- 2. God's Sovereignty in First Chapter
 - a. Verse 2: God gave them into his hands.
 Natan="to give" "hand over in judgment"
 - b. Verse 9: God gave Daniel favor
 - c. Verse 17: Gad gave them learning and wisdom

More significant for the Hebrews was the crisis of how do they behave as a people, hold to the faith, when they have lost their land, king, and temple in one fell swoop. How do they live as a minority group in an alien majority culture? How are they to fit in without being swallowed up?

 - b. Hananiah (Yahweh has been gracious \rightarrow Shadrach (I am fearful of Aku (moon god)

 - d. Azariah (Yahweh has helped) \rightarrow Abednego (Servant of Nabu (son of Marduk))
