The city of Nazareth where Jesus grew up represented hope to the Jewish nation that God would restore them fully. It kept the area from falling completely under Gentile dominion and provided a link to the Jewish Community in the South. Nazareth represents Jesus, our Messiah and it also provided a base for God's work in the future through the Messiah. In last week's sermon, Rev Walton made 3 prophetic statements that relate to our church specifically:

(1) This Congregation is our Nazareth

(2) This City is our Capernaum

(3) This Church is a reminder of the good plans God has for our nation, to bless it

Therefore we are to enter into the fullness God has for us as a congregation and as individuals. God's desire is to sprout and grow the seeds of destiny already planted in this church.
