

## V. Laying on of Hands

## A. Biblical Reasons and Examples

- 1. To Bless
  - a. Jesus with children

And He took them up in His arms, laid His hands on them, and blessed them. Mark 10:16

b. Jacob's blessing Isaac

Now when Joseph saw that his father laid his right hand on the head of Ephraim, it displeased him; so he took hold of his father's hand to remove it from Ephraim's head to Manasseh's head. Genesis 48:17

- 2. To transfer sin
  - a. Sin to offerings

Then he shall put his hand on the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him.

Leviticus 1:4

- 3. To heal
  - a. Jesus laid hands to heal

Now He could do no mighty work there, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them. Mark 6:5

b. Jesus commanded us to

they will take up serpents; and if they drink anything deadly, it will by no means hurt them; they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover. Mark 16:18

- 4. To receive the baptism with the Holy Spirit
  - a. Peter and John laid on coverts

Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit. Acts 8:17



- 5. To impart a spiritual gift
  - a. Paul and Timothy

Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you by prophecy with the laying on of the hands of the eldership. 1 Timothy 4:14

- 6. To commission for ministry
- a. Paul and Barnabas commissioned by the church Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away. Acts 13:3
  - 7. To impart authority
    - a. Moses to Joshua

Now Joshua the son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, for Moses had laid his hands on him; so the children of Israel heeded him, and did as the Lord had commanded Moses.

Deuteronomy 34:9

## **B. Practical Advice and Examples**

Do not lay hands on anyone hastily, nor share in other people's sins; keep yourself pure. 1 Timothy 5:22

And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you 1

- 2. Be careful who you lay hands on and impart to
- 3. When laying hands, wait until you're ready to release your faith. Be intentional about it.
  - a. Paul on the disciples at Ephesus
