1. According to verse 20, what is the foundation of the church?
2. What happens when a church (or a Christian life) is built on something other than God's Word and Jesus Christ?
3. How does Paul describe the church in verse 21? What does it mean that we are “fitly framed together”?
4. What does it mean that the church is “an habitation of God through the Spirit”? How does that change how we approach church?
5. Which part of God's blueprint—foundation, framework, or filling—stood out to you most in this message? Why?

2. *How does remembering your spiritual past impact the way you worship today?*

5. *Paul uses words like "fellowcitizens" and "household of God"—how does that shape your understanding of your identity in Christ?*
