- Hope a desire of some good, accompanied with at least a slight expectation of obtaining it, or
 a belief that it is obtainable. Different than a wish because of the possibility of possessing it.
 Hope therefore always gives pleasure or joy.
 - Confidence in a future event; to trust in with confident expectation of good.
- Two Matters that Make Hope Hope
 - 1. That which God promises that comprises hope
 - 2. The fact that God promised it
 - Heb. 6:10-19

III. Sermon:

The Salvation of Hope

{Rom. 8:24-25} - "For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it."

• "saved" - Preserved from evil; injury or destruction; kept frugally; prevented; spared; taken in

time.

- Your justification unto eternal life has granted you "hope", thus a renewed mind in sufferings, tribulations, trials.
- This renewed mind, this hope of glory "saves".
 - The effectual working of our hope when believed to save works by providing for our inner man details about the glory of the life to come to lessen and/or deplete the inward travail of our soul when our body experiences trouble, tribulation, persecution, sufferings, necessities, and infirmities.
 - The glory of the life to come when known and understood frees us from the travail of our soul that clings tightly to that which we want; knowing that God has something better for us.
 - The hope of glory is looking on that which isn't seen and collecting eternal thoughts to replace the earthly thoughts that come naturally based upon living in this natural body.
 - Therefore, when we believe in hope and are filled with glory there is a supernatural provision of God manifest while we experience hardship, that is, we respond in view of that hope and can even be filled with joy.
- The greater injury, superior to any destruction to the body, is the destruction of the soul by God's judgment upon it.
 - Many say they think suffering and hardship on earth is God's hell. This is man's wisdom attempting to sooth their conscience.
 - Do you not have breathe in your lungs?
 - Does not the sun rise each morning?
 - Does not rain upon the just and unjust?
 - Does not He give meat in its season?
 - Even in drought we have hope it will not last long....
 - Even in famine we have hope for humanitarian aid from fruitfulness from another part of the earth God created even though it be cursed...
 - No light is your lot, no sun, no mercies new each morning, but the travail of your soul, no rain, no water to drink, no place to find a drop of dew to quench thy thirst, but dryness an existence of God's judgment of being yet without Him exactly what the world wants.
 - No food, a gracious provision by God whether the herb or meat a place isolated with the cry of pride, arrogance, and foolishness.
 - Man may kill the body, but God is able to destroy the soul where you, your soul, will
 experience eternal travail.
 - Isa. 53
 - {:10} "put him to grief" The world may say, "good grief" not knowing that it is good grief compared to "the grief" of their eternal condemnation.

- {:11} "He shall see the travail of His soul" He shall see the travail of your soul and not be satisfied and 10,000 years you poor miserable soul that was lifted up in pride will have no advocate having spurned the only Advocate that God is satisfied His Son Jesus Christ.
- Therefore, because we are in Christ we possess life in the soul and it will not be destroyed, we will not face eternal ruin which eternally exceeds for each soul that which could come upon all present bodies now.
- Therefore, we suffer now beloved what is it to eternal destruction you will be glorified with the Author of life, the One who possesses the keys of death and hell and will never open those doors to you, they will not prevail against you.
 - Your depressed now your idleness hasn't contemplated 1 sec of irreconciable soul travail let alone an eternity of it.
 - You have much more in your present sufferings than you would have in your eternal sufferings.
 - Yet for you beloved is pleasures forevermore at the right hand of the Father. Therefore, sufferings are temporary, they remain just for a short time, they are light compared to the glory that shall be revealed in us.
 - Christ didn't just come to heal the physical body, but it to be evidence of the healing provided by the travail of His soul soul healing which is far greater. If all you think is Christ was a body healer you didn't read far enough go learn what that meaneth.

• The Salvation of Hope

- Frees you from the bondage of want because all you will ever want and need is satisfied in the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Such freedom is yours in Christ, but experienced by comparison. Comparing that which is offered you in this life to that which God promises in the life to come believing it, holding it, remembering it that you would want nothing.
- Fruit of Hope
 - Comfort to strengthen; to invigorate; relief from distress of mind
 - 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 "Blessed be God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God."
 - :8-9 trust in God which raiseth the dead
 - 2 Cor. 7:4, 13
 - 1 The. 4:18 "Wherefore comfort one another with these words."
 - 2 The. 2:17 "Comfort your hearts, and stablish you in every good word and work."
 - Confidence a trusting, or reliance; an assurance of mind or firm belief in the

integrity, stability or veracity of another, or in the truth and reality of a fact.

- Eph. 3:12 "In Whom we have boldness and access with confidence by the faith of Him."
