# Judge in yourselves: is it comely that a woman pray unto God uncovered? {1 Corinthians 11:13}

- "judge in yourselves" judge what what has come before and stated plainly
- "is it comely that a woman pray unto God uncovered?"
  - "comely" to stand out, to be conspicuous, to be eminent; to be becoming, seemly, fit
  - It wasn't comely at the time due to the custom the custom represented the principle of headship
  - To not participate in the custom made the woman stand out in a worldly way

## Doth not even nature itself teach you, that, if a man have long hair, it is a shame unto him? {1 Corinthians 11:14}

- "Doth not even nature itself teach you"
  - What nature?
    - Laws of nature that opposed to what has been produced by the devices of men
    - A mode of feeling and acting which by long habit has become nature (the course of things)
    - Example circumcision
      - □ Rom. 2:14 uncircumcision by nature
      - □ Gal. 2:15 Jews by nature
  - What does "even nature itself teach you"?
    - Teaches a "shame" why is long hair for men a shame? If God made men's hair to by nature grow long why is it a shame?
    - People "shame", culture, and society shame
    - The long established habit of women having long hair and men have shorter hair wasn't shameful
      - :6 "if it be a shame for a woman to be shorn or shaven, let her be covered."
        - What is determining the shame?

### But if a woman have long hair, it is a glory to her: for her hair is given her for a covering. {1 Corinthians 11:15}

- "But if a woman have long hair, it is a glory to her:" her long hair is a glory her hair is given for a covering to show headship
  - Custom of covering or not
  - Nature of the length of the woman's hair
    - Distinguish her as not only a woman, but substantiate the headship ordinance by God Word
  - 1 Tim. 5 word of God be not blasphemed
  - 1 Pet. 3 won without the word, by the conversation of the wive's

### But if any man seem to be contentious, we have no such custom, neither the churches of God. {1 Corinthians 11:16}

- "contentious" fond of strife
  - "we have no such custom"
    - No such custom regarding the uncovering and shavening of hair?, or
    - No such custom at all.
  - Paul's focus is the ordinances of God kept in peace which is praiseworthy.
    - More comely to be covered than uncovered according to the custom
    - If not going to be covered than more comely to have long hair according to nature
    - What is uncomely would be to pridefully refuse the custom or worse shave your head like the world to strive against the ordinance of God of a man and woman and headship.
