SHADOW

- Col. 2:17 - "shadow of thing to come" • obscurity, darkness, not fully revealed
- HEB. 8:5 - "the example (shadow) of heavenly things" • represent faintly or imperfectly
- HEB. 10:1 - "the law having a shadow of good"

- Rom. 5:14 - "the figure of Him that was to come"
- HEB. 9:9 - "which was a figure for the time then present"
- HEB. 11:19 - "received him in a figure"
