I. Intro/Review:

- "For as the body is one, and hath many members,"
 - The body is one yet has many members
- "and all the members of that one body, but many, are one body"
 - All the members although many are identified with the one body
- Spirit divides spiritual gifts severally as He will

II. Preview:

- By One Spirit all Baptized into One Body
 - Whether we be Jews or Gentiles,
 - Whether we be bond or free;
- All Made to Drink into One Spirit

III. Sermon:

For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

{1 Corinthians 12:13}

- "For by one Spirit"
 - Emphasis not numerous spirits, but spirituals (spiritual gifts) given by one Spirit.
 - Therefore, the diversity comes from one and works one
 - v4, v7, v8-10, v11
- "are we all baptized into one body"
 - "are we all"
 - The Spirit isn't concerned with former worldly identity
 - "whether we be Jews or Gentiles,"
 - "whether we be bond or free;"
 - Jn. 3:8
 - "canst not tell whence it cometh" before the foundation of the world
 - "whether it goeth" resurrection
 - Have no temporal measures of distinction like bond or free, Jew or Gentile concerning them that are baptized by the Spirit of God.
 - "baptized" purification unto sanctification that results in a new identification
 - Purified by what? Water, Spirit, Fire, the Word, etc
 - Sanctified? Separated for God's use

- Identification? In Christ, in one body
- Gal. 3:26-29
- Col. 3:11
- "into one body" significance
 - 1. 1 Cor. 10:17 one bread, one body of Christ
 - 2. Worldly differences that cause division subdued by identity in Christ Jews & Gentiles, bond or free, etc
 - 3. Spiritual gifts are given by the same Spirit to work the selfsame Spirit
 - 4. The issue is Christ.
- "and have been all made to drink into one Spirit."
 - "and have been all made" all into one Spirit all baptized into one body
 - So you have the "body and bread" issue, now you have the "drinking" issue
 - "all made to drink into one Spirit" 1 Cor. 10:16 communion of the blood of Christ
 - Our own forgiveness toward God works forgiveness toward others
 - Eph. 4:31-32
 - Love toward one another walking after the Spirit
 - Rom. 8 Spirit leads us
 - Rom. 12:1-3 soberness
 - Eph. 5:18 filled with the Spirit (influence) v21 "submitting yourselves one to another in the fear of God."
- This is 1 Corinthians 1:9-10 the fellowship of God's Son Jesus Christ our Lord to produce work for the same one and same purpose.

For the body is not one member, but many. {1 Corinthians 12:14}

- The Spirit of God baptized us into one body; however, as the physical body so also is Christ; that is, there is one body, but many members.
 - Many members but one body that worketh the selfsame Spirit to glorified the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - Therefore, there is one mind concerning our differences, that is, the purpose of the Lord Jesus Christ that unites us in their Spirit given differences.

• They are not to take worldly thinking of differences to divide, but rather see their differences within the framework of their singular identity to the Lord Jesus Christ.
