- Follow Paul as he follows Christ
  - Free from all, servant to all
  - Made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some
  - Let no man seek his own, but every man another's wealth

• The Lord's Supper

Now in this that I declare unto you I praise you not, that ye come together not for the better, but for the worse.

{1 Corinthians 11:17}

- 1. Reproof 1 Cor. 11:17-20
  - Phrases/Words/Expressions
    - (:17) "I praise you not ye come together...for the worse"
    - (:18) "there be divisions among you"
    - (:19) "must be also heresies among you"
    - (:20) "this is not to eat the Lord's supper."
  - "Now in this that I declare unto you I praise you not"
    - Php. 4:8-9 "...if there be any praise, think on these things. Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you."
    - "<u>praise</u>" commendation bestowed on a person for his personal virtues or worthy actions
      - Rom. 15:11 "...laud Him, all ye people."
      - 1 Cor. 11:2 "Now I praise you, brethren, that ye remember me in all things, and keep the ordinances, as I delivered them to you."
      - 1 Cor. 11:22 "...shall I praise you in this? I praise you not."
  - "in this" "that ye come together not for the better, but for the worse."

- The church is to "come together"
  - 1. Come together for the better (:17)
  - 2. Come together in the church (:18)
  - 3. Come together into one place (:20)
  - 1. Come together perfectly joined together (1 Cor. 1:10) not divisions
  - 2. Come together in the same mind and same judgment from fellowship of His Son (1 Cor. 1:9-10) not heresies
  - 3. Come together unto the Lord (1 Cor. 1:9; Rom. 14) not to eat the Lord's supper
- "not for the better, but for the worse."
  - For better or for worse they are the Lord's (1 Cor. 6)
  - Called to come together for the better
  - "better" (1x) useful, serviceable, advantageous; excellent (Php. 3; 2 Cor. 3)
    - 1 Cor. 12:31 "best"
    - Heb. 1:4 "better than"
    - Heb. 6:9 "better things", 7:19 "better hope", 7:22 "better testament", 8:6 "better covenant/better promises", 9:23 "better sacrifices", 10:34 "heave better...substance", 11:16 "better country", 11:35 "better resurrection"
    - Engage in the things of Christ the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord
  - "worse" less; inferior
    - 2 Cor. 12:15 "though the more abundantly I love you, the less I be loved."
    - Lack of love charity in 1 Cor. 13
    - Rom. 12-15

# For first of all, when ye come together in the church, I hear that there be divisions among you; and I partly believe it. {1 Corinthians 11:18}

- "For first of all" further explanation of the reproof, the heart of the matter, divisions is why worse
- "when ye come together in the church, I hear that there be divisions among you"
  - "hear" 1 Cor. 1:11, 1 Cor. 5:1
  - "divisions" schisma (schism); rent (garment)
    - In. 9:16, 10:19
    - 1 Cor. 1:10
    - 1 Cor. 3:1-4
  - "and I partly believe it." in regard to this (not measure)

- "in this respect" 2 Cor. 3:10
- "particularly" Heb. 9:5
- "behalf" 2 Cor. 9:3; 1 Pet. 4:16

## For there must be also heresies among you, that they which are approved may be made manifest among you. {1 Corinthians 11:19}

- "For there must be also heresies among you"
  - "heresies" sect (Acts 5:17),
    - Gal. 5:20 works of the flesh (1 Cor. 3)
    - 2 Pet. 2:1 damnable heresies
      - Denying
      - Consequence
    - 1 Cor. 1:9-10ff
    - That opinion different than the church, or a doctrine contrary to scripture, or behavior not according to godliness
- "that they which are approved may be made manifest among you."
  - God permits, God allows heresies to identify the approved and manifest them
    - (:30) "weak, and sickly among you, and many sleep."

When ye come together therefore into one place, this is not to eat the Lord's supper. {1 Corinthians 11:20}

- "When ye come together therefore into one place"
  - Conclusion of the reproof of their coming together
- "this is not to eat the Lord's supper."
  - 1. They are coming together
  - 2. They are coming together and eating a supper
  - 3. They are coming together but not eating the Lord's supper
    - Coming with divisions and heresies
  - The following verses of correction (:21-32) reveal their supper isn't the Lord's
    - "every one taketh before other his own supper: and one is hungry, and another is drunken."
    - 1 Cor. 4:8 "Now ye are full, now ye are rich, ye have reigned as kings without us:"
