 - Pauline confidence upon the experimental use of the knowledge of Jesus Christ
 - Php. 4:12 (Php. 4:9) 2 Cor. 12:7-10
 - "that this"
 - 1. "my bonds"
 - 2. "supposing to add affliction to my bonds"
 - "shall turn to my salvation"
 - "shall turn" the outcome
 - The nature of the salvation it dependent upon context
 - Options
 - 1. Eternal Salvation
 - 2. Physical Deliverance from Prison Salvation
 - Php. 1:25
 - 3. Shame Salvation
 - Php. 1:20
 - "through"
 - The means of his salvation

- 2. "the supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ"
 - "the supply" assistance, relief; act of supplying what is wanted
 - "of the Spirit of Jesus Christ" is the supply
 - Rom. 8 firstfruits of the Spirit
 - 2 Cor. 3
 - Php. 4

According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by death.

- "according to"
 - 1. "my earnest expectation and"
 - 2. "my hope"
 - Romans 8
 - 2 Cor. 1:22
 - 2 Thee. 2:16-17
- "that in nothing I shall be ashamed" Negative expression of what Paul is knowing it is going to turn to
- "but that will all boldness, positive expression Eph. 6 prayer freedom in speaking, unreservedness in speech (Rom. 1)
 - "as always, so now also" Php. 4:11-12
 - Acts 18:9 "...be not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:"
 - Acts 27:24 "...fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar"
- 2. Christ Magnified in My Body
 - "Christ shall be magnified"
 - Through the Spirit of Jesus Christ Christ is magnified
 - "magnified" to speak or act for the glory or honor of someone or something else; esteem greatly, extol, make much of
 - Matt. 23:5 "enlarge" (phylacteries)
 - Luk. 1:46 "magnify" Mary's soul
 - Luk. 1:58 "great" mercy
 - 1. "in my body"
 - The vessel in which to magnify the Lord with

- 2. "whether it be" 1 Cor. 4:21-23
 - 1. "by life, or"
 - Physical life he will continue to preach and live unto Christ
 - 2. "by death"
 - Physical death
 - Rom. 14:7-9

For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. {Philippians 1:21}

- "For to me"
 - 1. "to live is Christ" His gain in this world although he may suffer lose is Christ
 - 1 Cor. 15:19
 - 2 Cor. 6:0
 - 2. "to die is gain"
 - Eternal Life, Heaven, Presence of the Lord
 - Glorified Body Php. 3; 1 Cor. 15
 - Our conversation is in heaven Php. 3
 - Set affection on things above Col. 3

But if I live in the flesh, this is the fruit of my labour: yet what I shall choose I wot not. {Philippians 1:22}

- "But if I live in the flesh" to live is Christ, to magnify Christ in His body by life
 - "this is the fruit of my labour"
 - 1. Magnify Christ
 - 2. Life the furtherance of the gospel
 - 3. Death suffering, affliction

For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better:

{Philippians 1:23}

- "For I am in a strait betwixt two"
 - Approving things that are excellent abound in love
 - 1. "having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better:"
 - "depart" 2 Tim. 4:6

• "with Christ" - 2 Cor. 5 - present with the Lord; 1 The. 4

Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you. {Philippians 1:24}

3. The Mind of Christ

- 2. "Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you."
 - Even though he sees and knows to be with Christ is far better, he seeks to abide in the flesh
 - It is needful for the Philippians to stay

And having this confidence, I know that I shall abide and continue with you all for your furtherance and joy of faith;
{Philippians 1:25}

- "And having this confidence" of his freedom from imprison
 - "I know that I shall abide and continue with you all" more needful for you
 - "for your"
 - 1. "furtherance...of faith"
 - 2. "furtherance...of joy"
 - Edification in the faith produces joy

That your rejoicing may be more abundant in Jesus Christ for me by my coming to you again.
