  - Judges 1-1 Samuel 16 from Judges to Kings (Samuel last Judge to Prophets (2 Kings 17:3))
  - 5 Lessons
  - One of final lessons is Israel's rejection of their King (God)
- Foreknowledge of King Deut. 17:14-20
  - Judges 17:6, 18:1, 19:1, 21:25 "there was no king in Israel"
  - 1 Samuel 8:1-22 the people want a king
  - 1 Samuel 9:2 Saul (from 1 Sam. 9 to the end (chapter 3) Saul is king)
