#### Preview:

- Godly provision for us always to be victorious
  - The only time we are not victorious is when we are not ministering the gospel
  - o Victory doesn't come solely by the results
  - Victory also comes by manifesting His knowledge

#### Sermon:

{2 Cor. 2:12-17} Furthermore, when I came to Troas to preach Christ's gospel, and a door was opened unto me of the Lord, (13) I had no rest in my spirit, because I found not Titus my brother: but taking my leave of them, I went from thence into Macedonia. (14) Now thanks be unto God, which always causeth us to triumph in Christ, and maketh manifest the savour of his knowledge by us in every place. (15) For we are unto God a sweet savour of Christ, in them that are saved, and in them that perish: (16) To the one we are the savour of death unto death; and to the other the savour of life unto life. And who is sufficient for these things? (17) For we are not as many, which corrupt the word of God: but as of sincerity, but as of God, in the sight of God speak we in Christ.

- 2:14 "Now thanks be unto God"
  - "which always causeth us to triumph in Christ"
    - 1 Corinthians 4 & 9
    - Always causeth us to triumph
      - ☐ The triumph isn't based upon results although there is reason to triumph when one hears the gospel and believes.
      - ☐ Instead, there is a different measurement to this "triumph"
    - "triumph" -
      - ☐ The Romans Ceremony "the Triumph"
        - Public celebration to sanctify the success and completion of a foreign war
        - In the processional there were "incense-bearers"
        - It was a "savour" of victory among the victors, but there were also those captors, part of the spoils of victory, that was a seal of their ultimate perishing.

  - To some it is foolish, a stumbling stone of offense resulting in proceeding on toward eternal death.
- □ "and to the other the savour of life unto life."
  - To others the message results in eternal life and glory
- "savour" that which is acceptable to God
  - □ 3 Parties which we are "savour" to and that we "savour"
    - 1. Unto God a sweet savour of Christ
    - 2. Unto Saved the savour of life unto life
    - 3. Unto Perish savour of death unto death
