Sermon:

(1 Timothy 1:5) Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and of a good conscience, and of faith unfeigned:

- "pure heart" wrong affections
 - o "pure" separate from all heterogeneous and extraneous matter; unmixed, genuine
 - o "heart" affections, passions (Rom. 1)
 - o Gold, frankincense, candlestick, incense, olive oil, table, blood of the grape
 - o Ex. 28:36, 30:35 pure linked to holiness
 - 2 Cor. 6 & 7:1
 - Col. 3:12-14
 - o Job 4:17 God is pure
 - o Ps. 12:6, 19:8, 119:140 God's words are pure
 - o Pro. 30:5 (:12)
 - o Jas. 3:17
 - Ps. 24:4 pure...not lifted heart or sworn deceitfully
 - Matt. 5:8 blessed are the pure in heart
 - o Rom. 14:20; 1 Tim. 4:1-5
 - Php. 4:8 (Php. 1 not with good conscience)
 - o 1 Tim. 3:9, 5:22
 - o 2 Tim. 2:22
 - o Tit. 1:15
 - o 1 Pet. 1:22
- "good conscience" wrong motives wrong standard upon which to make judgments

- "good" Complete or sufficiently perfect in its kind; having the physical qualities best adapted to its design and use; opposed to bad,imperfect, corrupted, impaired.
- "conscience" internal or self-knowledge or judgment of right and wrong
 - Lawful or unlawfulness of our own actions and affections (approves or condemns)
- "faith unfeigned" Not feigned; not counterfeit; not hypocritical; real; sincere; as unfeigned piety to God; unfeigned love to man.
 - o Eph. 6:24; Php. 1
 - Not just knowledge of love
 - Rom. 12:3ff
 - 1 Cor. 8:1-3, 13:1-3
 - Sincere Being in reality what it appears to be; not feigned; not simulated; not assumed or said for the sake of appearance; real; not hypocritical or pretended.

(1 Timothy 1:6) From which some having swerved have turned aside unto vain jangling;

- "swerved" To wander from any line prescribed, or from a rule of duty; to depart from what is established by law, duty or custom; to deviate.
- "vain jangling" Wrangling; quarreling; sounding discordantly

(1 Timothy 1:7) Desiring to be teachers of the law; understanding neither what they say, nor whereof they affirm.

- "desiring to be teachers of the law" what's wrong with this
 - o Rom. 6
 - o Rom. 8
 - o Gal. 3
 - o 1 Cor. 15
- "understanding neither what they say"
- "nor whereof they affirm" To assert positively; to tell with confidence; to aver; to declare the existence of something; to maintain as true; opposed to deny.
 - o The law worketh wrath, not love
 - Rom. 4:15
 - Rom. 8:5, 13:6ff
 - Matt. 22:38
- (1 Timothy 1:8) But we know that the law is good, if a man use it lawfully;
- (1 Timothy 1:9) Knowing this, that the law is not made for a righteous man, but for the lawless and disobedient, for the ungodly and for sinners, for unholy and profane, for murderers of fathers and murderers of mothers, for manslayers,
- (1 Timothy 1:10) For whoremongers, for them that defile themselves with mankind, for menstealers, for liars, for perjured persons, and if there be any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine;
 - "perjured" Willfully to make a false oath when administered by lawful authority or in a court of justice; to forswear; as, the witness perjured himself.

(1 Timothy 1:11) According to the glorious gospel of the blessed God, which was committed to my trust.

- "glorious gospel of the blessed God"
 - The gospel of God as it concerns His Son (the gospel of Christ) fully declared, revealed, concluded, and manifest.
