- The husband is to love his wife:
 - As Christ loved the church
 - Succeed where Adam failed
 - o Loves as himself, one flesh
 - Nourishes & cherishes
 - o Selfless love simulated
- King of the home, not a tyrannical dictator, but a minister, servant head ruling with godly selfless love
 - Not be afraid to be taken advantage of, because fortified within with patience to guide and grow each individual in the home.
- Husband to wife wife to husband (consummation, continuation, completion)

Sermon:

- The husbands primary responsibility is to love your wife
- Loving like Christ is loving sacrificially

(1 Peter 3:7) Likewise, ye husbands, dwell with them according to knowledge, giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel, and as being heirs together of the grace of life; that your prayers be not hindered.

- "Likewise, ye husbands" 1 Peter 2:13
 - A mutual submission, the wife toward the husband, now the husband toward the wife
- · "dwell with them according to knowledge"
 - Loving like Christ is loving considerately

 "according to knowledge" - knowledge of whom your wife is as a woman, according to God's ordinance and design, her role within marriage.
 More considerably, this is being sensitive to her desires, needs, wants, goals, and dreams.
 Understand what she is thinking - initiating in asking her what is on her mind
☐ Therefore, loving your wife this way, submitting to her involves listening to her
 One could suggest loving her sacrificially you must love "according to knowledge" to listen to know what needs you are privileged to meet.
giving honour unto the wife, as unto the weaker vessel"
o The woman doesn't have the same physical strength
 Being physically weaker isn't demeaning, in fact, a greater opportunity to display a greater strength spiritually
□ 2 Peter 2:10-11
• The honour the husband is to give to is wife is constant for her identification of the weaker vessel is constant.
 Honouring one in a weaker position is that sacrificial, selfless love
□ Romans 12:10 - 1 Corinthians 12:22-26 □ Romans 12:16
 This feature of love is a protecting, chivalrous, protecting love
 Such honour ought to bear the fruit of praise from the husbands lips toward the wife whom "professes godliness", concerned with her inner strength, brings forth good works. Proverbs 31:28, 31 Proverbs 11:16
□ Proverbs 12·4

• "and as being heirs together of the grace of life"

• This woman is much different than:

□ Pro. 9:13,11:22, 14:1, 21:9, 27:15

o "heirs together" - communion

- In the Greco-Roman world this was a foreign concept. In fact, the husband had "patria potestas" (power of a father) that is absolute authority and had no obligation to consider the welfare and desires of his wife and children.
- Husbands were generally uninterested in friendship with their wife.
 They expected them to merely take care of the house and bear children.
- The godly love the husband is to have toward his wife is a cultivating love, seeking communion not only in body, but in mind and affections. A love that seeks intimacy not only in bed, but benevolence that each join in is a consummation of the intimacy they share in all things.
- The husband as the head, loving like Christ loved the church, pursues in always deepening the intimacy of communion within marriage.
- The husband's love isn't responsive based upon what his wife has done for him, but because of what he desires to do for her.
- This is Christ's love there is nothing in us that attracts Christ to us, but in spite of this Christ loves us. Its' a symphathetic love that seeks to understand us, assist us, comfort us, and meet our true need.
 - ☐ Hebrews 2:9-10, "it became him"
 - :11, "not ashamed to call them brethren" (honor)
 - :14, "took part" so many husbands that don't take part in what their wives do, what their children do
 - :16, "took on" tough, persistant, willing
 - :17, "behoved" To be necessary for; to be fit for; to be meet for, with respect to necessity, duty, or convenience.
 - The woman is not only fit for man, but man is fit for the woman (bone of my bone, flesh of my flesh)

• "that your prayers be not hindered"

- o It doesn't say that you cannot pray
- Doesn't say that God wouldn't provide what He has chosen to provide according to His word.
- o It says that your prayers would be hindered
 - This indicates once again the supreme responsibility it is for the husband to love his wife.
 - Not loving your wife in this way, yet seeking to request something from

God yet He has called to love your wife in this manner

- □ Matt. 5:22-24
- If you marriage is strained because of your lack of love then your relationship toward God is strained. To not connect the two is an improper understanding of scripture.

Pure Love

Providing Love

- Ephesians 5:28-29
- Christ provided all He has without expecting anything in return providing love that is influential
- Not just financially, but your time, personal goals and pleasures
 - Give up career if necessary

Permanent Love

- Ephesians 5:30-31
- Forgiveness
 - Difficulty of living with each other
 - Arguments, dislike, and distaste
 - How much has God forgiven you?
 - This is the manner you are to forgive
 - □ Eph. 4:32, Col. 3:12-14

The Fruit of the Spirit

- Not just a ceremony, not just a certificate, not just the one flesh physical intimacy, but a one spirit
- Galatians 5:22-23
- Marital bliss, unbeliever influential Cross provoking love
- True romance and joy
