 - "forbearing" (verb)
 - Definition to hold up, to hold one's self erect and firm; to sustain, to bear, to endure
 - Verses (Translated)
 - Then Jesus answered and said, O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I suffer you? bring him hither to me. {Matthew 17:17 KJV}
 - He answereth him, and saith, O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? how long shall I **suffer** you? bring him unto me. {Mark 9:19 KJV}
 - And Jesus answering said, O faithless and perverse generation, how long shall I be with you, and **suffer** you? Bring thy son hither. {Luke 9:41 KJV}

 - For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or [if] ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well **bear** with [him]. {2 Corinthians 11:4 KJV}
 - For ye **suffer** fools gladly, seeing ye [yourselves] are wise. {2 Corinthians 11:19 KJV}
 - For ye **suffer**, if a man bring you into bondage, if a man devour [you], if a man take [of you], if a man exalt himself, if a man smite you on the face. {2 Corinthians 11:20 KJV}
 - With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, **forbearing** one another in love; {Ephesians 4:2 KJV}
 - Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also [do] ye. {Colossians

3:13 KJV}

- So that we ourselves glory in you in the churches of God for your patience and faith in all your persecutions and tribulations that ye **endure**: {2 Thessalonians 1:4 KJV}
- For the time will come when they will not **endure** sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; {2 Timothy 4:3 KJV}

III. Sermon:

Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. {Ephesians 4:3}

1. "endeavouring"

- Definition
 - To hasten, make haste, to exert one's self, endeavour, give diligence
 - Study
 - early 12c., *studien*, "to strive toward, devote oneself to, cultivate" (virtue, vice, wisdom, art, etc., sometimes translating Latin *occupare*), from Old French *estudiier* "to *study*, apply oneself, show zeal for; examine" (13c., Modern French *étudier*).

This is from Medieval Latin *studiare*, from Latin *studium* "*study*, application," originally "eagerness," from *studere* "to be diligent," which is reconstructed to be from PIE *(*s*)*teu*- (1) "to push, stick, knock, beat" (see <u>steep</u> (adj.)). The notion appears to be "pressing forward, thrusting toward," hence "striving after."

It is attested from c. 1300 specifically as "apply oneself to the acquisition of learning, pursue a formal course of *study*," also "read (a book or writings) intently or meditatively." It is from mid-14c. as "reflect, muse, think, ponder." The broad meaning "seek to learn particulars of by observation" is from c. 1600; that of "regard attentively" is from 1660s.

- Verses (Translated)
 - Only [they would] that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do. {Galatians 2:10 KJV}
 - **Endeavouring** to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. {Ephesians 4:3 KJV}
 - But we, brethren, being taken from you for a short time in presence, not in heart, **endeavoured** the more abundantly to see your face with great desire. {1 Thessalonians 2:17 KJV}
 - **Study** to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. {2 Timothy 2:15 KJV}
 - Do thy **diligence** to come shortly unto me: {2 Timothy 4:9 KJV}
 - Do thy **diligence** to come before winter. Eubulus greeteth thee, and Pudens, and Linus, and Claudia, and all the brethren. {2 Timothy 4:21 KJV}
 - When I shall send Artemas unto thee, or Tychicus, be **diligent** to come unto me to Nicopolis: for I have determined there to winter. {Titus 3:12 KJV}
 - Let us **labour** therefore to enter into that rest, lest any man fall after the same example of unbelief. {Hebrews 4:11 KJV}
 - Wherefore the rather, brethren, give **diligence** to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall: {2 Peter 1:10 KJV}
 - Moreover I will **endeavour** that ye may be able after my decease to have these things always in remembrance. {2 Peter 1:15 KJV}
 - Wherefore, beloved, seeing that ye look for such things, be **diligent** that ye may be found of him in peace, without spot, and blameless. {2 Peter 3:14 KJV}
- "to keep" (heavenly sand we keep we toil)
 - Definition
 - To attend to carefully, take care of; to guard; to keep, one in the state in which he is
 - The oneness of the Spirit has taught becomes the ground we toil in, the heavenly dirt we labor, the spiritual soil we sow and reap.
 - The Spirit and His unity is the garden of the Lord that which the one new man created in Christ Jesus for us to work in.
 - Gen. 2:15 "And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it."
 - Gen. 2:7 "And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and

breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul."

- Eph. 2 quickening spirit
- Eph. 2:10 created in Christ Jesus unto good works

2. "the unity of the Spirit"

- Definition
 - Agreement; oneness
- Verses (Translated)
 - Endeavouring to keep the **unity** of the Spirit in the bond of peace. {Ephesians 4:3 KJV}
 - Till we all come in the **unity** of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: {Ephesians 4:13 KJV}
- Substance
 - The oneness of teaching to both Jew and Gentile
 - Any distinction or fleshly cause for division and dissension dealt with the unity of the Spirit
 - Unity in Adam and Unity in Christ
 - Christ's death, burial, and resurrection that the Spirit baptizes Jew and Gentile into one body
