  - Gentiles in the flesh
  - Called uncircumcision
  - Without Christ
    - Aliens from the commonwealth of Israel
    - Strangers from the covenants of promise
    - Having no hope
    - Without God in the world
- But Now
  - Not Isa. 11:10
  - Not Isa. 42:6; Isa. 49:6; 54:3; 60:3, 5; 61:6; 62:2
  - Not Isa. 66:10-12
  - Not Rom. 15:8-12
  - Isa. 9:7
- The Unsearchable Judgment of God In Christ Rom. 11:30-36
  - 2 Cor. 5:19 reconciling of the world In Christ for the world (Rom. 2; 2 Cor. 5)
    - Rom. 5:10
    - Rom. 9:22-24
    - Rom. 11:12-15
  - God's nighness to the world
    - Deut. 4:7 God nigh to Israel
    - Lev. 21:21 come nigh to God
  - Not imputing trespasses
    - Rom. 5:13 From Adam to Moses sin not imputed when no law Adam's transgression
    - 2 Cor. 5:19 not imputing their trespasses unto them (not shewing wrath)
  - Acts 14:27 "how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles"

### III. Sermon:

## For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us;

{Eph 2:14}

- "For He is our peace"
  - "For" further explanation of "but now in Christ Jesus"
    - Although Israelites were nigh they were not nigh enough
    - Gentiles were far off
    - Now made nigh not by the blood of bulls and goats, but "by the blood of Christ".
  - "He is our peace"
    - "He" the Lord Jesus Christ by His blood
    - "our" Israelites and Gentiles | circumcision and uncircumcision
      - □ Not just Israelites and Gentiles but believing Israelites and Gentiles
    - "peace" a state of quiet or tranquility; harmony; concord; a state of reconciliation
      - "enmity" Eph. 2:15 the quality of being an enemy; the opposite of friendship; ill will
      - 1. Sin & Ungodliness Rom. 1:20-32 (:24)
        - Dishonor own bodies between themselves
        - All under sin (Rom. 3:9)
      - 2. The Corruption of Circumcision Rom. 2:17ff
        - Not a Jew outwardly, but inwardly
        - Lev. 26:19 break pride of power
        - Isa. 9:9, 28:1, 3
        - Eze. 16:49
        - Rom. 11:22-23
      - 3. The Law of Commandments
        - Against nations defilement
        - Lev. 18:1ff (:24, 28)
        - Rom. 3:20 "for by the law is the knowledge of sin"
        - Deut. 11:28-29 blessing and curse for the nations
- "who hath made both one"
  - 1. "for He is our peace" Christ is our peace by virtue of what is explained
  - 2. "who hath made both one" Christ is our peace by making both one
    - Two becoming one
      - 1. Eph. 1:10

- 2. Eph. 2:12, 15
- 3. Eph. 5:31
- 3. "and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us;" Christ is our peace by making both one by breaking down this middle wall
  - What is the middle wall of partition?
    - Many say this refers to the Temple's outer court for the Gentiles, that separated from the inner court into which only Jews might enter.
    - Not addressing the physical wall for it was unbroken when Paul wrote this
    - The spiritual wall, what verse:15 states
      - "even the law of commandments contained in ordinances"
    - Romans 7:12 the law is holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good."
    - Romans 7:14 For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, sold under sin."
  - Circumcision before the law but also in the law
    - Jn. 7:22-23 "...(not because it is of Moses, but of the fathers;)..."
    - Rom. 2:25 "For circumcision verily profiteth, if thou keep the law:"
  - Circumcision, the law, and the man-made enmity
  - "and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us;"
    - Christ has done this; however, Israel is ignorant of it and don't believe it Rom. 9:30-31, 10:1-4
  - <u>Review</u> The exceeding greatness of God's power in Christ to the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints. (Eph. 1:19-23)

Having abolished in his flesh the enmity, even the law of commandments contained in ordinances; for to make in himself of twain one new man, so making peace; {Eph 2:15}
