#### III. Sermon:

#### 1. The Christian Athlete

Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.

{1 Corinthians 9:24}

#### 1.1 - The Runner - run to obtain

- **1.1.1** "know ye not"
  - Drawing upon their Isthmian games where they among other games were commonly known for running, wrestling, boxing, and disc throwing.
- 1.1.2 "that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize?"
  - All run, but only one receives the price
  - The issue isn't the equation that as Christian's only one will receive the prize.
  - The issue is the manner in which you run that is to receive the prize
- 1.1.3 "So run, that ye may obtain."

- So run as the one to receive the prize
- "ye" everyone run to win the prize
- "obtain" to take eagerly, to seize, and possess; to gain possession of a thing
  - "comprehend" Eph. 3:18
  - "apprehend" Php. 3:12-13

## And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. {1 Corinthians 9:25}

#### 1.2 - The Wrestler - temperate in all things

- 1.2.1 "And every man that striveth for the mastery"
  - Both running or wrestling equated in the striving
  - "striveth" to endeavour with strenusou zeal; to contend, struggle, with difficulties and dangers
  - "mastery" superiority in competition
    - Same theme as the one to obtain the prize
  - <u>Summary</u>: Paul as the apostle committed to preach the gospel does so in a way to win the prize. The prize being the salvation of others and the glory of Christ.
- 1.2.2 "is temperate in all things."
  - "temperate" not excessive; moderate in the indulgence of appetites and passions.
    - 1 Cor. 7:9 "But if they cannot contain, let them marry:..."
      - Acts 24:25 "And as he reasoned of righteousness, temperance, and judgment to come..."
      - Gal. 5:23 "meekness, temperance..."
      - Tit. 1:8 "but a lover of hospitality, a lover of good men, sober, just, holy, temperate;"
      - Tit. 2:2 "that the aged men be sober, grave, temperate..."
    - In the world that is in eating, drinking, and sexual indulgence
    - "temperate" contextually is being servant to all, the forsaking of liberties for the edification of others.
      - 1. Involves not only the forsaking of earthly lusts, but
      - 2. The sacrifice of liberties
- **1.2.3** "Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible."

- The eternal life of others
  - Php. 4:1 "...my joy and crown..."
  - 1 The. 2:19 "For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing?"
- Reward for faithful service in the Lord's business
  - 2 Tim. 4:8 "Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord..."
  - Col. 3:22-25
- We will already receive and incorruptible body, this is an incorruptible crown based upon our sacrificial behavior in the service to Christ.
  - Php. 3:13-21
- Doesn't fade away, glory exceeds the glory of the corruptible
- Rom. 8 bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty (and incorruption) of the children of God.

### I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: {1 Corinthians 9:26}

#### 1.3 - The Boxer - fight with purpose

- 1.3.1 "I therefore so run"
  - Conclusion
- 1.3.2 "not as uncertainly;"
  - Not doubtful; not without knowledge
  - Uncertainly not sure, not confident
- 1.3.3 "so fight I, not as one that beateth the air:"
  - Knows purpose
  - Knows enemy
  - Knows how to train
  - Knows what outcome looking for

# But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway. {1 Corinthians 9:27}

- **1.4.1** "But I keep under my body"
  - Rom. 8 mortify the deeds of the body

- Rom. 12 present bodies...
- 1.4.2 "and bring it into subjection"
  - Rom. 6
- 1.4.3 "lest that by any means"
  - Carnally 1 Cor. 1-6
  - Abuse of liberty 1 Cor. 7-9
- 1.4.4 "when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway."
  - 2 Tim. 2:5 lawfully strive
    - Faithful to message
    - Faithful in manner of life
  - 1 Cor. 4:1-2 faithful steward
