#### Bible Discussion

#### Read **Hebrews 11:36-40**

#### Read Hebrews 12:1-2

Why do you think the writer of Hebrews uses this illustration of a race when talking about our spiritual journeys with Christ?

Is there a sin that currently "clinging" to you? Or is there one that you have had to physically remove from your life because it was slowing you down?

What should be our focus in the midst of this endurance race? Why do you think this helps us?

#### Read **Hebrews 12:11**

Do you agree with the statement that discipline comes out of a place of love? Why or Why not?

How have you seen the guidance of the Father in your past spare you from pain in the future?

#### Read **Hebrews 12:12-15**

Are Christians known for striving for peace or causing division? Explain your answer?

Why is striving for peace with everyone a key part of this discussion of running an endurance race?
