Read Luke 2:15–20

What do you think the Shepherds believe they will gain by making room in their schedule to go find baby Jesus? Are you surprised by the response in finding Jesus?

Read Romans 10:15-17

Why do you think Paul calls those who are messengers of the Good News- "Beautiful"? How does it inspire you to carry the Good News to others?

Capstone Lab
